## TRANSFER TO MIDDLE OR HIGH SCHOOL

At the start of the Autumn Term September 2009 each child due to transfer to a Community Middle or High school should bring home an application form and a copy of The Essential Guide to North Tyneside Schools.

You should complete the Common Application Form (CAF) and you may apply for up to three schools. We strongly advise that you name more than one school in case your choice of school is over-subscribed. If you do not give us your second and third preferences and we are unable to offer a place in your first preference of school we will allocate a place at the nearest school to the parental address that has a place available. Naming a school as your first preference does not guarantee you a place at that school. Repeating the name of one school does not improve the chances of securing a place there.

This Authority operates an equal preference allocation scheme equal preference means that all applications are considered together, no matter what order the preferences are listed on the application form. All the applications are then ranked in accordance with the admissions criteria for that school. Completed forms must be returned to your child's current school in time to reach Children, Young People and Learning Directorate by Friday 23 October 2009.

Where demand exceeds places available the over-subscriptions criteria in this brochure applies.

You may be required to provide proof of your address. It should be noted that an offer of a school place may be withdrawn if information supplied by you on your application is intentionally misleading or fraudulent (for example, a false claim to residence in a catchment area). Where a place is withdrawn, the application must then be considered afresh, and a right of appeal offered if a place is refused.

A school place may also be withdrawn if you do not respond to the offer within a reasonable time.

### Online Admissions

At the start of the Autumn Term September 2009 when the admissions process begins, North Tyneside will be offering an online admissions service for entry in September 2010. If you have access to a computer and you wish to complete your application online, you can find a link to this service at www.northtyneside.gov.uk or go directly to

If you are considering applying for a place in the Roman Catholic High School you are advised to read the criteria to be used to determine the allocation of places at the back of this booklet.

Parents submitting an on-line application will be sent a response on **Monday I March 2010**.

A late application may prevent you from gaining a place at your preferred school.

If your preferred school is not published in this booklet please contact the school to find out what the admissions arrangements are.

It is important that you notify the Head of Access and Inclusion in writing of any change of circumstances which would affect the offer of a school place, i.e. change of preference, or a change of address or to place your child in a private school.

# ADMISSIONS TO VOLUNTARY AIDED (CHURCH) SCHOOLS

Responsibility for admissions to Roman Catholic and Church of England schools lies with the individual Governing Bodies. Common Application Forms can be obtained from the individual schools. It should be noted that eligibility for assistance with home to school transport is in accordance with the LA home to school transport policy and will only be considered in relation to the nearest appropriate school.

# ADMISSION TO 6TH FORM IN COMMUNITY SCHOOLS

The majority of secondary schools in North Tyneside provide courses of study for post 16 (6th form) students. The majority of students in school 6th forms have transferred from Year 11 in their current school, but all schools offering Post 16 education have places available for external students.

The entry requirements for 6th form are largely dependent on the course of study that a student wishes to access. They are the same for internal and external students. Details of specific requirements and courses available may be obtained from individual schools. All schools publish information about their Post 16 provision.

Applicants refused admission to a 6th form are entitled to appeal to an independent appeals panel.

## **EDUCATION ADMISSION APPEALS**

If parents are dissatisfied with the response to their preferences, they have the right to present their case to an Independent Appeals Panel. The Panel will be made up of 3 or 5 members, including a lay person, who must not

have any connection with the LA or the school in question a person who will have educational experience, as a teacher, parent or governor of another school. A clerk will also be in attendance to organise the meeting, give legal advice to the Panel and record its decisions.

You will be given at least 7 school days notice in writing of the place and time of the meeting of the Appeals Panel at which the appeal will be heard. You will be given the opportunity to appear before the Appeals Panel to present your case. You may be accompanied by a friend or representative, however you do not have to attend and you can elect to allow the appeal to be considered on the basis of the statement contained in your Notice of Appeal. If you choose not to attend, the appeal will be decided upon the information available.

At least seven working days before the hearing by the Appeals Panel you will be sent a written statement from the LA summarising how the admissions policy applies to the case in question, and the reasons for the decision. Also you will be given the names of the panel members and clerk who will be in attendance.
