Please could I have information on:

- 1. What energy efficiency improvements have been made by your council to homes in your area in each of the past five years (including both council-owned and privately owned homes)? Please can you break this information down by:
- a. the number of homes that received energy efficiency improvements in each year
- b. how much money was spent in each year on energy efficiency improvements for homes
- c. A brief summary where appropriate of what overall improvements were made
- Please could you provide a breakdown of the Energy Performance Certificate of all commercial properties owned by your local authority. Please could you provide a) the number of commercial properties rated in each category (A-G), and b) state whether any of these have improved in the past five years.

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The Council does not hold all EPC ratings or certificates in a centralised location. All EPCs are kept on the national EPC register which can be accessed individually at https://www.ndepcregister.com/reportSearchAddressTerms.html?redirect=reportSearchAddressByPostcode To assist with this, we have provided a schedule of all commercial properties owned by the Council.

With regard to part b) EPCs last for 10 years, therefore we do not have a record of ratings that have improved within the last 5 years.
