Request:

In accordance with the legislation relating to the Freedom of Information Act, would you please provide the following information;

- 1) Please identify ALL costs relating to the design and implementation of the stopping up and diversionary measures relating to the Southbound highways, known as Grand Parade, Beverley Terrace, Victoria Crescent, Promenade, to include the A193 road (Park View) on 1st July 2020.
- 2) Please also highlight the actual or estimated weekly cost of maintaining this **procedure**.

Response:

North Tyneside Council has received £427,489 from the regional Emergency Active Travel Fund (EATF) allocation of £2,262,000. Approximately £284,000 of North Tyneside's EATF funding has been spent on the Coastal Strip scheme of which £242,000 were materials which will be re-deployed and re-used on future highway schemes.

Ongoing maintenance of the temporary cones and barriers is costing approximately £1,500 per week and is covered in our EATF allocation above. This cost will cease to be incurred on installation of the fixed "bolt-down" materials w/b 17th August.
