Supported employment is the term for high quality, personalised support for people with disabilities and/or disadvantages which enables them to seek, access and retain employment in the open labour market. It is a "place, train and maintain" approach that does not rely on long periods of pre-vocational training or a basic level of qualification or experience.

Supported Internships are a form of study programme delivered by Education and Skills Providers. They are generally funded by the Education and Skills Funding Agency but local authorities can contribute funding through Element 3 funds.

a) Supported Employment services and

b) on supported internship provision?

a. Supported Employment

We do not have a dedicated Supported Employment provision; however our Learning Disability Enablement Service have, historically, supported people who have a diagnosed Learning Disability to gain employment and also signposted people to external support provision.

b. Supported Internships: The amount spent by the Employment and Skills Service on Supported Internships was:

2017/18 - £7,310

2018-19 - £13,211.61

Budget 2019-20 - £13,211.61

The provision of Supported Internships funded from North Tyneside Council is delivered by Education and Skills providers.

Our current provision is to people receiving support from our social care services.
