Response:

The bridleway has started to sink and required attention as it is also a national cycle route. The vegetation was cut back last Winter and we have now undertaken a 'full scrape' to level the area ready for a full dust construction of the bridleway. The area has been scraped to 4m wide to allow drainage channels to be installed, when this is completed the bridleway will remain 3m wide.
