All reported enquiries regarding defects within the carriageway are recorded on our Symology electronic data system, however, the system does not allow me to separate which ones relate solely to potholes and which are for other issues such as requests for major surfacing works, therefore, I am unable to provide the figures for how many individual potholes were reported to highways. I can, however, identify how many reports we received for defects in the carriageway which resulted in an inspection.
