Place based integrated care (PBIC)

- Based around a natural geographical footprint
- Co-terminous with Council and partnership agreement and CCG
- **Light** local and tactical commissioning function – moving away from traditional contractual discussions
- Reduce commissioning costs significantly
- More of a place-based joint planning mechanism than 2012 type structure
- Ensure choice requirements are met
- All partners in PBIC to agree vehicle of how money is managed, local priorities, ownership of system issues/problems and solutions / based on CCG allocations
- Connection with Regional ACS on broader strategy issues

Regional ACS

- Same footprint as the enlarged STP
- Similar footprint to old SHA.....
- Strategic role for the patch with focus on:
 - Planning
 - Oversight – pulling functions from NHSE and NHSI
 - Strategic commissioning and Spec Com
 - Clinical networks
 - Deanery
 - AHSN
 - Population Health Analytics/Data/Intelligence
 - Regional Digital Strategy ?
- Strategic capital / new capital
- Material service reconfiguration

Subsidiarity is a principle of social organization that holds that social and political issues should be dealt with at the most immediate (or local) level that is consistent with their resolution. The [Oxford English Dictionary](#) defines subsidiarity as "the principle that a central authority should have a subsidiary function, performing only those tasks which cannot be performed at a more local level".^[1] The concept is applicable in the fields of government, [political science](#), [neuropsychology](#), [cybernetics](#), management and in military command ([mission command](#)). Subsidiarity is a general principle of [European Union law](#). In the United States of America, the principle of [States' Rights](#) is enshrined in the constitution. Although the principle is older, its expression in the term "subsidiarity" was first coined in 1891 by the [Roman Catholic Church](#) for its social teaching.
