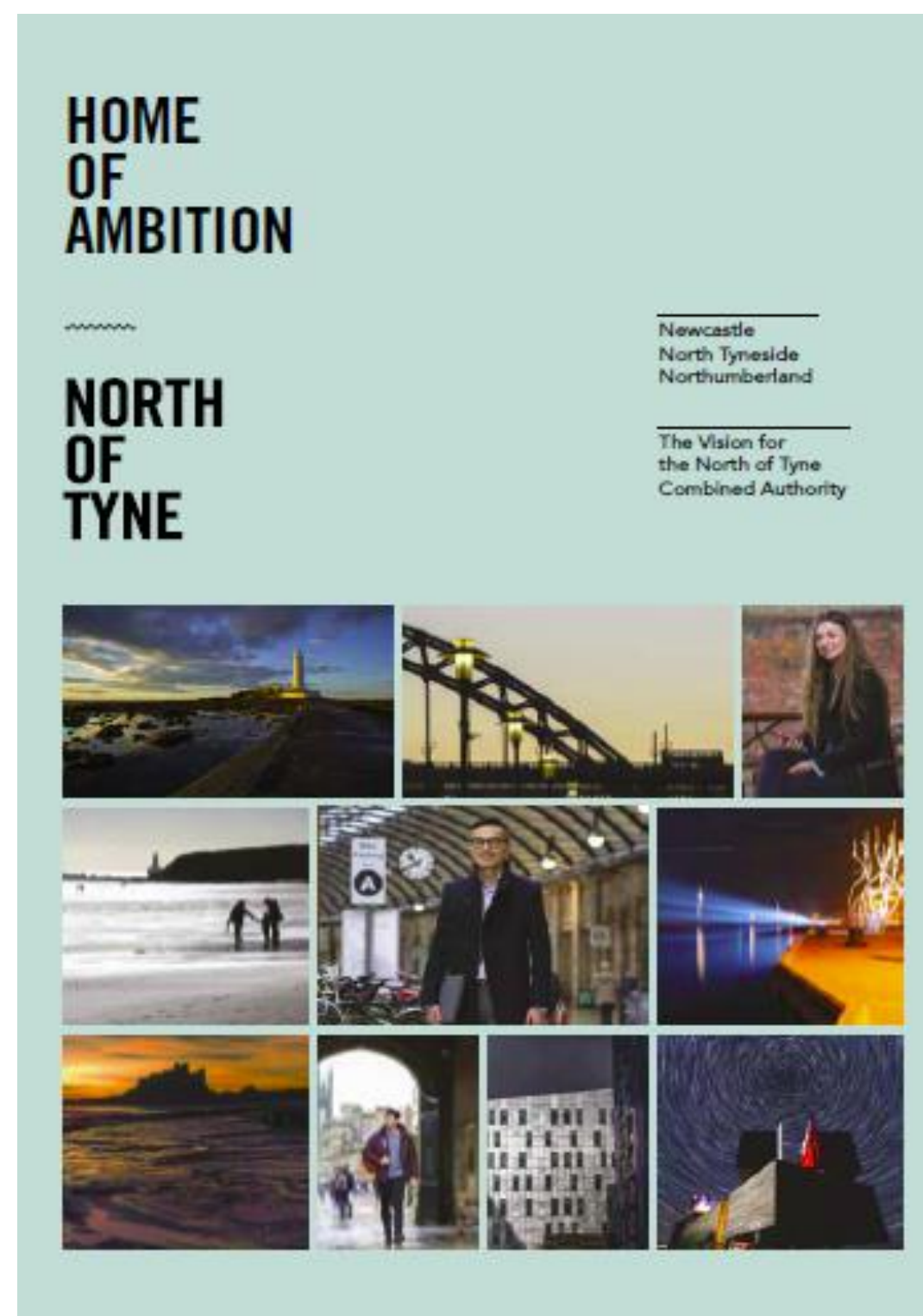

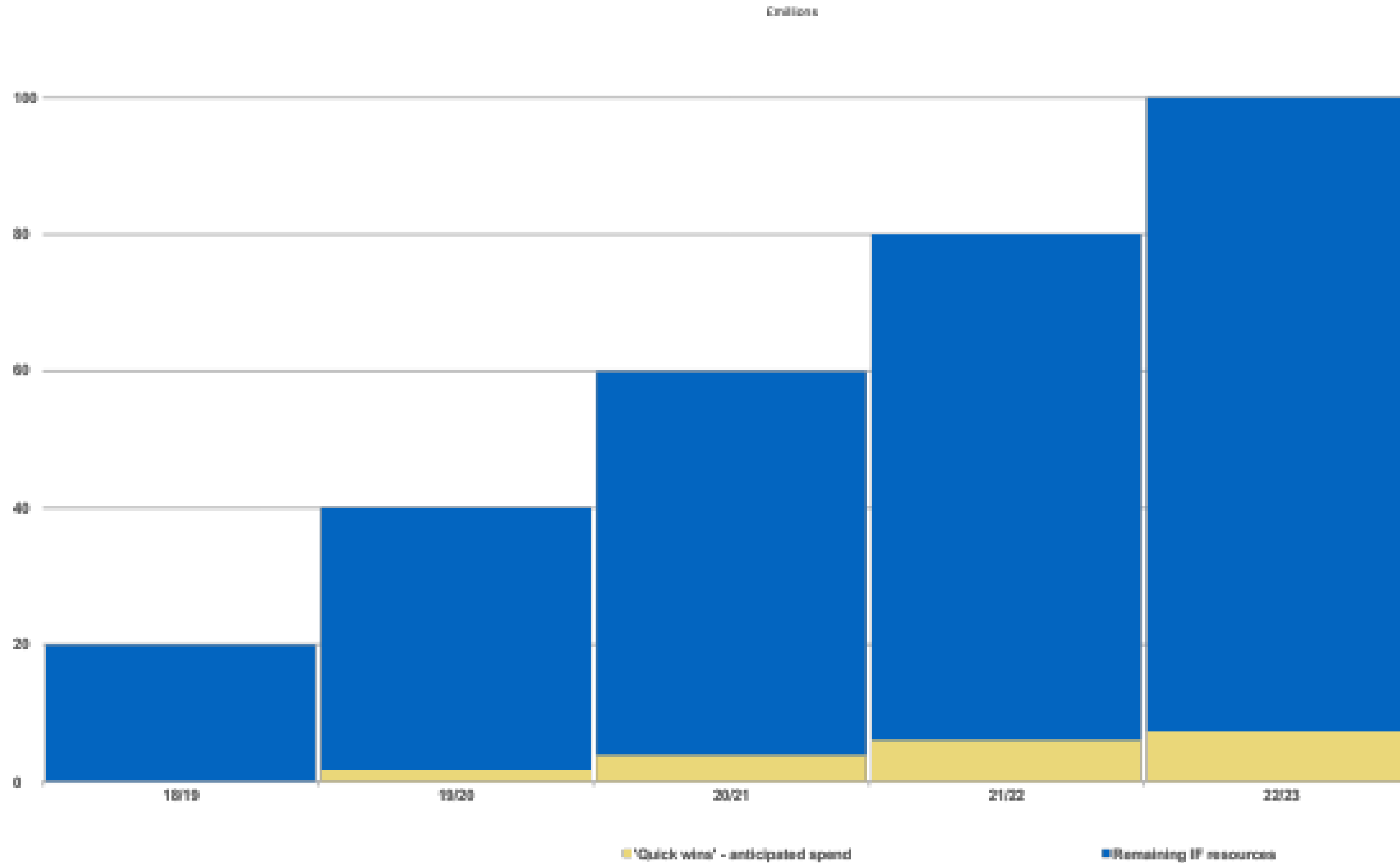

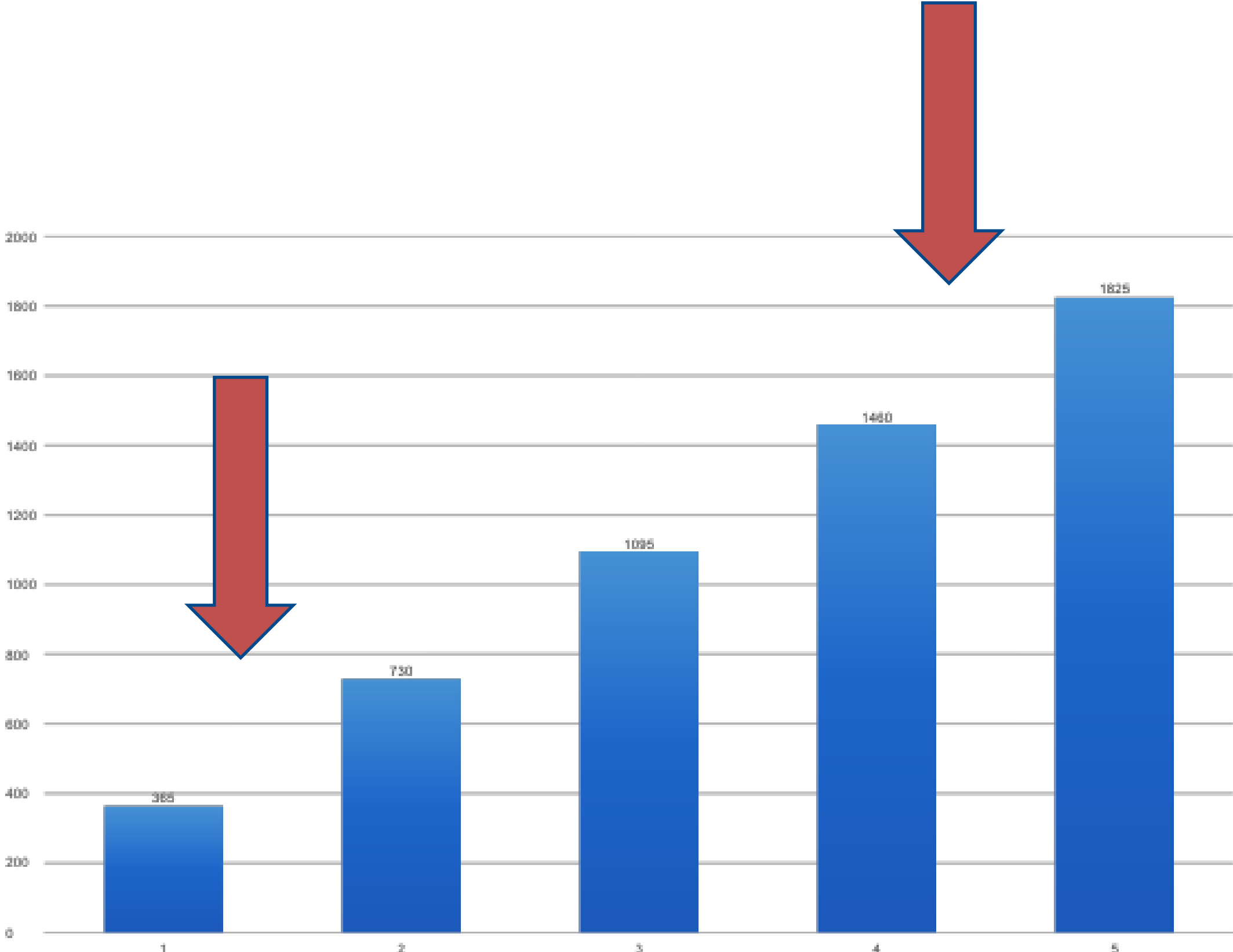


Investment Fund - expected spend profile of 'quick wins' and remaining resources
