1. Welcome & Introductions

GH welcomed members to the group and introductions were made.

2. Apologies

Paul Hanson, Lindsey Blackmore, Anne Grimes.

3. Notes of Previous meeting and Matters Arising

It was noted that WB was not going to send the letter to Board Chairs but that she would draft the letter to go out from Cllr Burdis as Chair of the SNT.

There were no matters arising.

4. Community Safety Strategy

LO updated on the progress of the Community Safety Strategy noting that the report went to Cabinet in December and approval was given. The next step in the process was to take to Overview & Scrutiny, who recommended expanding the consultation process and to look at how Education are involved with the consultation and with the wider Community Safety Board. The Overview & Scrutiny Board did raise some issues of anti-social behaviour across borough but this will be addressed separately to the Strategy. The next steps for the Partnership are to look at the objectives for partner agencies, the previous work plan will be circulated to members to review and consider progressing these.

**ACTION: All members of the group were asked to provide feedback on the work plan.**

5. Performance Quarter 3

GC presented the available data for quarter 3 and informed the group that the Community Safety Survey and I-Quanta data have not been published to date. As of the

next financial year GC will be presenting a new model of the data to be me intelligence led.

Although there has been increases across the monitored headings but these are in line with our peers.

The group discussed the youth offending data and it was noted that these do not give a true reflection of the good work of the YOT as there has been recent changes to the MOJ recording model. The group noted that the YOT will be invited to the next Board meeting to provide an update on their service.

GC reported that a regional data group has been established and this will help provider a wider picture and bring in wider data sources. JM noted that he can discuss with GC further what information can be collated from Probation.

#### 6. Community Safety Update Report

JC reported on the progress of DHR4 and DHR5 and noted that they had received notification of a possible DHR but the Core Group agreed that this did not meet the criteria and that an appreciative review would be conducted.

To review the hate crime agenda JC attended the Gateshead Hate Crime Tension & Monitoring Group to identify their structures and agendas. This proved very useful and North Tyneside will be looking at utilising this method to take forward the work of the the North Tyneside Group. HB noted that North Tyneside have reviewed the Community Engagement team within North Tyneside and JC can liaise with Sgt Claire Kimberly.

Feedback was provided from the learning disabilities conference that was held at Sunderland University and the WhoRYa campaign and website.

An update was given on Dovetail noting this has been a pilot Channel Panel project implementing Local Area Channel Coordinator posts.

#### 7. Anti Social Behaviour Toolkit

Issues had been raised from Members around their concerns with anti social behaviour across the borough. To clarify issues it was agreed that a ASB Toolkit will be developed. This will identify what is ASB, how to report it and how the Council deal with it. It was noted that there is a lot of good multi agency work on going and this will bring that together. WB noted that this should be part of the work of the new strategy.

#### 8. Items for Information – Addresses Causing Concern Briefing

The latest briefing document was circulated for information.

#### 9. Any Other Business

GH asked that members can let JC know if they would like to do a presentation of the work they do and how this links with the Partnership.

A joint local authority bid was being submitted to the PCC to develop training for Adolescent Parent Domestic Violence. The YOT were included in the bid for North Tyneside. The results of the bid should be available by end of March.

JC made the Partners aware of some funding becoming available to home fire safety. This will be shared with Walking With for possible home safety for refugees moving in to new properties and to Anne Grimes to consider home safety of mobiles/ I Pads etc with young people.

LO noted that she attended a LGA Modern Day Slavery conference in Newcastle and this was Chaired by CB. The conference was well attended and a lot was learned.

LO noted that the new CCTV control room will be going live from March 2018 and recommended that the next Board meeting be held at White Swan Centre to allow board members to view the resources.

#### 10. Date & Time of Next Meeting

The next meeting has been scheduled for 1 May 2018, although this will be confirmed as there could be possible problems with PURDAH.
