PART 1

1.1 Executive Summary:

The Chief Executive was given delegated authority by Cabinet on 28 November 2022 to make any amendments that were be necessary to the Business Case on the merger of the Newcastle upon Tyne and North Tyneside Coronial areas, in consultation with the Elected Mayor, before its submission by him to the Chief Coroner and Ministry of Justice on behalf of the Authority.

It has been necessary for minor amendments to be made to the Business Case before its submission.

1.2 Recommendation(s):

It is recommended that the Chief Executive: -

- (1) Make the necessary amendments to the Business Case referred to in the report attached to this re[port;
- (2) Submit the Business Case as amended to the Chief Coroner and the Ministry of Justice on behalf of the Authority.

1.3 Forward Plan:

Twenty eight days notice of the future of the Coroner's Service in North Tyneside first appeared on the Forward Plan that was published on 23 May 2022.

1.4 Council Plan and Policy Framework

1.4.1 This report does not directly align to the priorities in the Council Plan. The Authority has a statutory duty to appoint a Senior Coroner and to provide sufficient resources for the Coroner to be able to undertake that role.

1.5 Information:

- 1.5.1 Cabinet agreed in principle to the merger of the Newcastle upon Tyne and North Tyneside Coronial areas in September 2019 subject to development of a Business Case supporting the merger.
- 1.5.2 Officers from the Authority and Newcastle City Council have prepared a draft Business Case which Cabinet endorsed at its meeting on 28 November 2022 and formally agreed to the merger of the Coronial areas.
- 1.5.3 Cabinet agreed to give the Chief Executive the delegated authority to make any necessary amendments to the Business Case before its submission to the Chief Coroner and the Ministry of Justice on the basis that he would consult with the Elected Mayor on any such amendments.
- 1.5.4 It has been necessary to make amendments to the Business Case which are highlighted in the attached Business Case. The amendments do not significantly change the Business Case presented to Cabinet and corrects errors where necessary.

1.6 Decision options:

The following decision options are available for consideration by the Elected Mayor: -

Option 1

That the Chief Executive agrees to the recommendations in paragraph 1.2

Option 2

That the Chief Executive does not agree to the recommendations in paragraph 1.2

Option 1 is the recommended option.

It implements the decision taken by Cabinet on 28 November 2022 to agree to the merger of the Newcastle upon Tyne and North Tyneside Coronial areas of which the submission of the Business Case is an interictal part.
