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North Shields Embankment Walkway 21st December 2022

Dear Resident / Business,

I am writing to you following several complaints from local residents and businesses regarding disruption caused by the ongoing works to the Embankment Walkway.

Firstly, I would like to express my sincere apologies for any inconvenience, discomfort or concern these works have caused so far. I wrote to you several months ago explaining that these works would be disruptive, which is a consequence of the complex nature of the scheme. I wanted to write to you and let you know the current position and to reassure you now the works have started.

In order to keep the slope of the embankment stable, it is necessary to reinforce the bank using sheet piling. Ideally, this should produce a lot less noise than it is at present, however, when hitting hard structures and stiff ground a more higher level of drilling is required, producing higher levels of noise and vibration.

Our construction partner, Willmott Dixon, are closely monitoring the noise, vibration levels and movement points on a continuous basis during operational periods. Given the disruptive nature of the works, a Council team are regularly visiting site to check on progress of the works, ensuring they remain within thresholds.

I would like to reassure you that these monitoring processes are in place to ensure no damage or significant disruption is caused to nearby properties, but I understand that this may be a concern to homewoners living or working close to the works. If you have any concerns regarding the works, please contact us on the address above and we shall be happy to discuss these with you and to help look at options to mitigate the impact.

As set out in the planning permission for the embankment, we will continue to only operate between the hours of 8am-5pm, Monday to Friday, limiting works to daylight hours on working days to reduce the impact on residents as much as possible. The sheet piling works are expected to stop for the Christmas period on 22nd December 2022 and will start again on 9th January 2023.

It is hoped the sheet piling installation at the top of the bank will be complete by 20th January 2023, with works moving further down the bank. This means residents and businesses on Tyne Street and surrounding streets at the top of the bank should experience much lower levels of noise and vibrations than they have so far in the project. However, this does unfortunately mean that properties on Liddell Street and Bell Street will experience an increase in noise and vibration from the works.

Additional sound blankets have been installed along the hoarding line to minimise noise as much as possible going forward.

I would like to reiterate that this is the most disruptive period of the works to the new and improved Embankment Walkway. Completion of the sheet piling stage is expected to be late March 2023. I would like to thank you for your continued patience while we undertake these disruptive works and will keep you updated on progress.

About the North Shields Embankment Walkway:

Commencing in September 2022, the new high-quality walkway is aimed at improving access where accessibility can be difficult between the improved town centre and vibrant Fish Quay, making it easier for people to travel between the two parts of town.

The walkway will feature green open spaces and there will be route options to suit different needs, including step-free routes and steps with handrails, as well as a direct route from top to bottom via steps.
