This Record of Decision relates to the approval given by the Cabinet Member for Environment to install pedestrian crossings in locations at Broadway, Beach Road, Grand Parade, Percy Park Road and East Street, Tynemouth, and set aside one objection received to the proposal.

7. Decision(s)

The Cabinet Member for Environment has considered the objection and has decided to:

- (1) set aside the objection in the interests of increasing safety for all road users and contributing to ensuring that highway conditions are conducive to support greater usage of cycling, walking and wheeling; and
- (2) determine that pedestrian crossings should be established in accordance with the proposal.

8. Reasons for the Decision(s)

Regarding the objection from SL – the Cabinet Member for Environment noted that the design of the proposals was felt to have reduced as far as feasible any potential conflict between cyclists and pedestrians. The Cabinet Member for Environment further noted that the proposal formed part of the Sea Front Sustainable Route proposals, which will provide improved cycling, walking and wheeling links to local destinations in coastal areas of North Tyneside.
