



North Tyneside is host to 3 major International, National and Regional cycle routes and the Waggonways Network.

Coast and Castles

Following the Coastline you will experience:

St Mary's Lighthouse (1898 until 1984), which is now a visitor centre and the surrounding

nature reserve. Tynemouth Priory & Castle (an important burial place of saints and kings), The Volunteer Life Brigade (the first of its kind anywhere in the world) and the Monument to Lord Admiral Collingwood who took command at the Battle of Trafalgar following Nelson's death. North Shields Fish Quay, which dates back to the 13th Century and houses Clifford's Fort, built in the 17th Century as a coastal defence

ID Reivers Regional Cycle Route (Start/Finish)

Marks the early development of the steam engine with the Stephenson Railway Museum. The museum is home to "Billy", the forerunner to the world famous "Rocket" The coal industry is also remembered and celebrated with interpretational panels along the vastly improved Waggonways Network.
