



## Domestic Homicide Review 9 – Jane

### Action Plan

<b>Recommendation One</b>	
<p>That the Domestic Abuse Partnership ensure that there is professional and community awareness, that the escalation to abusive behaviours and most serious violence is a significant risk in relationships that are ending, even where there may be no known prior history of abusive behaviour.</p>	
<b>Action to Take</b>	<b>Lead Agency</b>
<p>The Domestic Abuse Partnership to review training and awareness for all commissioned services and council staff specialising in domestic abuse roles to ensure that practitioners are aware of the risks when relationships are ending.</p>	<p>North Tyneside Domestic Abuse Partnership</p>
<p>The Domestic Abuse Partnership to consider a community awareness campaign to raise awareness of the risks when relationships are ending and signpost people to sources of advice and help.</p>	<p>North Tyneside Domestic Abuse Partnership</p>

## Recommendation Two

That the Domestic Abuse Partnership and Safeguarding Adult Board provide assurance that domestic abuse and adult safeguarding training provides frontline staff with skills to understand the profile and risk factors associated with homicide-suicide.
