1. Apologies, Welcome & Introduction

The Chair welcomed everyone to the Green North Tyneside Board

2. Presentation from Tyne & Wear Fire & Rescue Service

Kevin Hepple – Area Manager, Community Safety, gave a presentation on the Tyne and Wear Fire and Rescue Service Environmental Strategy.

Key was writing the Strategy down and identifying responsible individuals and ownership across the service. Leadership needed at all levels. The appointment of Carbon Champions was critical. Reassured that the three Key statements of the Strategy still hold true

Some key points included:

- Buildings LED lights clearly work
- Transport diesel reduction needs to be part of the specification
- Operational standard operating procedures now all include environmental impact
- People carbon champions
- Engineered solutions Deliver carbon reduction, but performance in owned sites much better than PFI sites but a complex issue

- Procurement sustainability built in
- Waste revised contract. Biggest challenge was removing personal waste bins
- Projects Integrated into Estates Annual Plan
- "What you don't measure, you don't do" but it's a lot of work.

Budget £600k over 3 years. Demonstrated have delivered sustainable savings. Asking for further funding for LED lighting and hybrid vehicle.

April 13 estimate carbon reduction now around 17% from base, with target of 22% by April 15.

Now embedded into the structure – It's just 'Business as Usual'.

Chair thanked Kevin for his presentation. All were impressed with progress to date.

4. Task and Finish Group – Carbon Award		
To date 31 companies have requested and received packs of information. The awards have been promoted through NTC local supply chain. Awards to date are: • 2 Bronze Redesdale Primary, Tyne Met College • 1 Silver Redesdale Primary (progression from Bronze) • 1 Gold North Tyneside Council GNT partners were requested to promote the Carbon Awards to their local suppliers. A Green Business category will feature in the 2013 North Tyneside Business Awards – Green Business Award sponsored by the NTSP GNT Board. Applications for the business awards are now in circulation. The Bronze, Silver and Gold Awards are a journey to carbon reduction. Bronze and Silver status are self certified by the participating organisation. It was confirmed that prior to any organisation being accredited with a Gold Award, a light but tough audit is undertaken by NTC staff. The Awards were developed by a Task and Finish team and they are bespoke to NT.	ALL	
5. Task and Finish Group - Partner Engagement and Behaviour Change		
Board Members were reminded of the agreed objectives of the Household Energy Behaviour Change Project. Presentation slides attached. The procurement process resulted in the appointment of NEA. The Task and Finish Group thanked the Chair, Cabinet Member and Head of Environmental Services for their support in reaching a major milestone in the project

PH wanted it noted that the Task and Finish groups have resulted in high quality, robust products – the Carbon Reduction Award and the Household Energy Behaviour Change Project.	
NEA presented on their organisation remit and the proposed project delivery. NEA - National Energy Action – it is a national charity.	
This project has been identified as particularly exciting as accessing college age students is a real gap nationally in meaningful energy efficiency education. This group are identified as the next generation of house holders. The GNT project requires a bespoke course for this age and this area. Being able to deliver such an innovative project in TyneMet significantly adds value to the work. Hope to be able to continue to monitor in the longer term. As the Parent charity of WarmZone they will pick up and target those in fuel poverty.	
The project provides wide ranging benefits and opportunity to feedback to wider NTSP partners. Learning from the pilot, successes can be translated into other groups of society e.g. Age UK.	
Chair noted the use of social media as critical to engage with the participants. PS asked about accessing the wider services of NEA, e.g. to provide technical input on technology. NEA has provided NTC with a membership of the network of services for the duration of the project. NTC can access support through standard membership, business support group and research team. Some work is chargeable and done on a consultancy basis. Potential to access social responsibility funding.	
NEA visitors were thanked for their presentation and the Board looked forward to receiving the results of the pilot.	
6. Future Projects	
Eco and Energy Efficiency Measures – reported that following the full robust procurement process the contract was awarded to WarmZone Community Interest Company. The contract started 2 September. To be targeted to properties and people in need, and higher value measures. Initial Project Board Meeting held. Identified an opportunity to link with local ward members to identify those in need. It was noted that the added value part of this contract includes free consultation advices.
