Supplementary Planning Document  
Adoption Statement - February 2018

This statement is published by North Tyneside Council to fulfil the requirements of regulation 14 of the Town and Country Planning (Local Planning) (England) Regulations 2012.

The Buildings and Parks of Local Architectural or Historic Interest Supplementary Planning Document (SPD) was adopted by North Tyneside Council on 12<sup>th</sup> February 2018.

Any person with sufficient interest in the decision to adopt the SPD may apply to the High Court for permission to apply for judicial review of that decision. Any such application for must be made promptly and in any case not later than 3 months after the date on which the SPD was adopted, that is by 12<sup>th</sup> May 2018.

Under Section 23 (1) of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004, the Council has modified the SPD to take into account representations made in relation to the document and any other relevant matters. Modifications are included in the accompanying Consultation Statement.
