LEISURE ORIENTEERING IN WALLSEND PARKS

This permanent orienteering course has been organised by Newcastle and Tyneside Orienteers and is supported by North Tyneside Council.

ABOUT ORIENTEERING

This permanent orienteering course has been developed to give you a chance to try a non-competitive or leisure form of the sport of orienteering, using your map reading skills to navigate round a course of markers or controls.


Your challenge is to visit the 'controls' or markers of your chosen course in the correct order, writing down the code letters in the corresponding square as you visit each marker.

THE MAP

Study the map carefully to find out the meaning of the symbols. **Yellow** shows open ground. **White or green** shows tree/bush planting. Main tracks and paths are shown. **Brown** shows hard stand. **Black dots** show boulders. **Brown contour lines** show land shapes. Note big features such as the bandstand, lake or burn which are big features and will help you 'orientate' the map (hold it so it matches the lie of the land).

The large arrow marks the direction of Magnetic North on the map.

Red circles with an accompanying number are marked on the map. These circles represent the permanent marker 'controls' and the number is shown on each control. Each control has its own description. See below for picture of a control. The number is that shown on your control description list. The letters will vary and you record the one(s) in the position(s) indicated on your control card.



The **Red triangle** on the map marks the start and the finish for all the courses. It is recommended that you start and finish at the notice board inside North Road park entrance. **Black lines** /////// mark OUT OF BOUNDS areas. Please observe these and respect and keep off cultivated and rockery areas.

This course has been planned by Newcastle and Tyneside Orienteers in accordance with normal orienteering practice. However, it is not possible for the planner or the site managers to keep a constant eye on the area. Users must, therefore, accept that neither the planner nor the site managers can be held responsible for any accidents, injuries, losses or damage which may occur whilst orienteering.

Course B: 1.3 km. Medium - more route decisions needed

Start/Finish at the notice board inside North Road park entrance, then 12, 9, 3, 1, 5, 7, 4, 6, 8, 13

Course C: All controls in any order or make up your own.

Beyond Richardson Dees Park (involves road crossing – take care)

Course D: Medium

Expand course A into Hall Grounds after #9 or follow this extension on its own (1.0km.) 22, 23, 28, 24, 25, 26, 29, 30, 27

Course E: Medium

Expand course B into the Arboretum after #1 or follow this extension on its own (1.0km.) 17, 16, 19, 14, 20, 21, 18, 15

We hope you enjoy your taste of orienteering. Its great attraction is that it can be as leisurely or as strenuous as you like. Your local club, Newcastle and Tyneside Orienteers (NATO), organises events to suit all ages and levels of ability. All are welcome to come along and take part.
