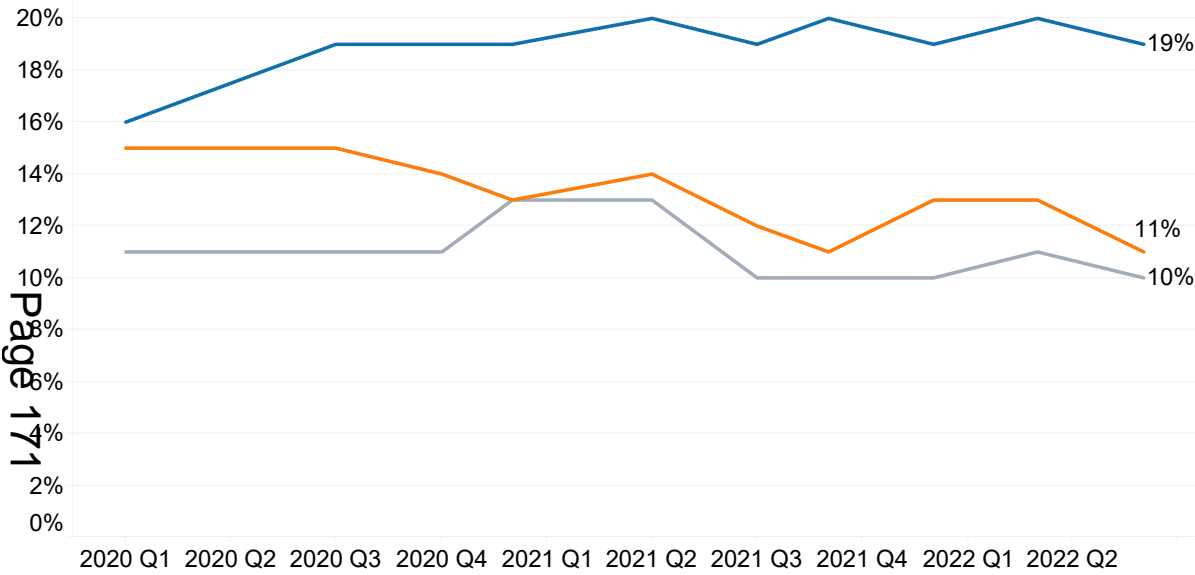

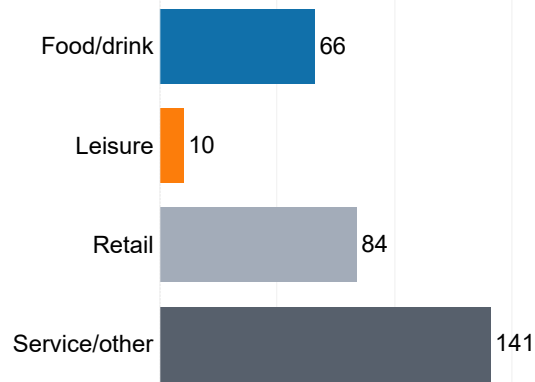

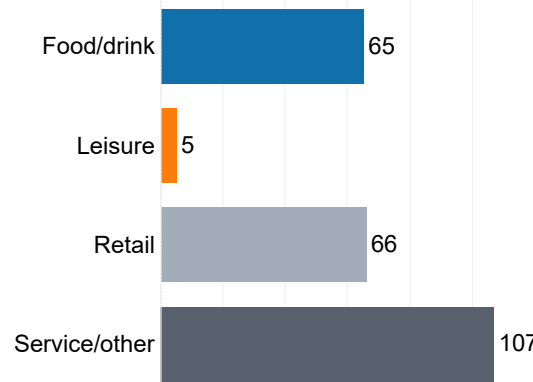
Town Centre Vacancy Rate



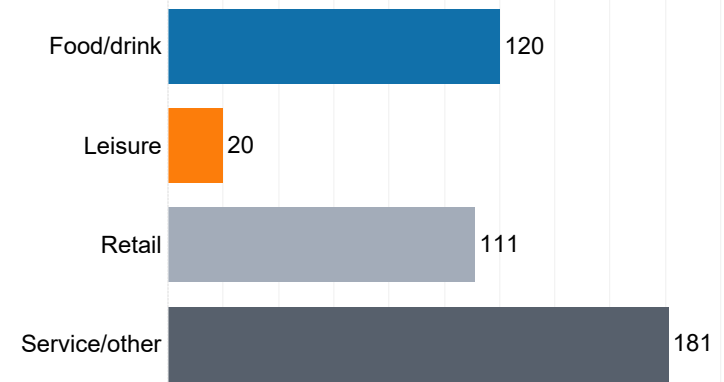

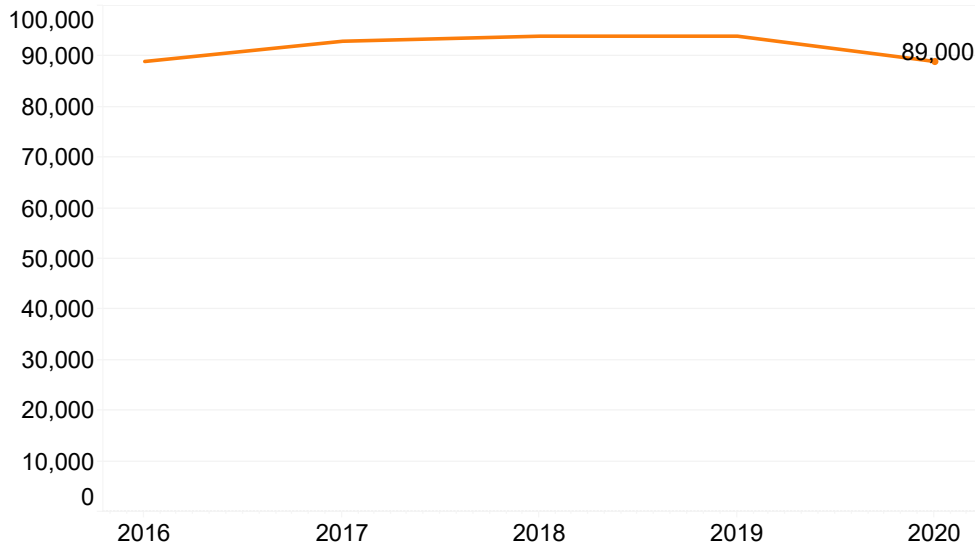

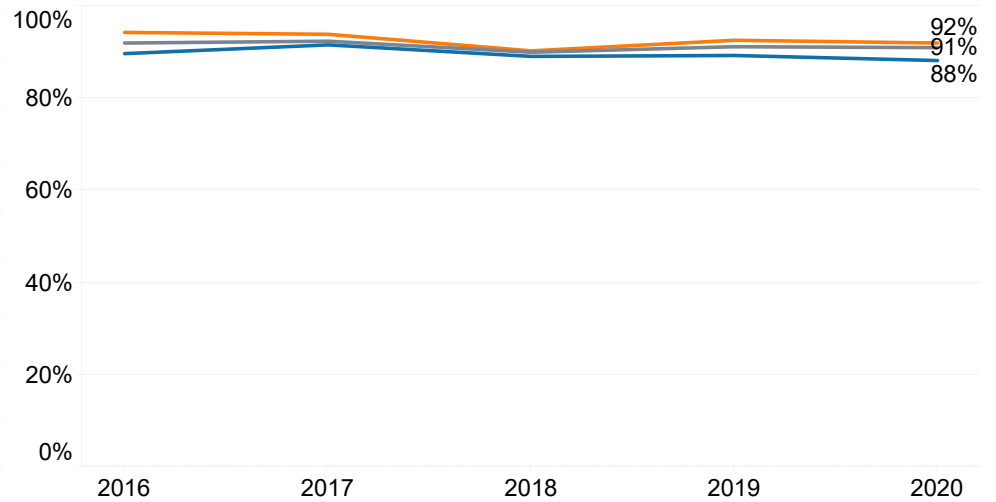

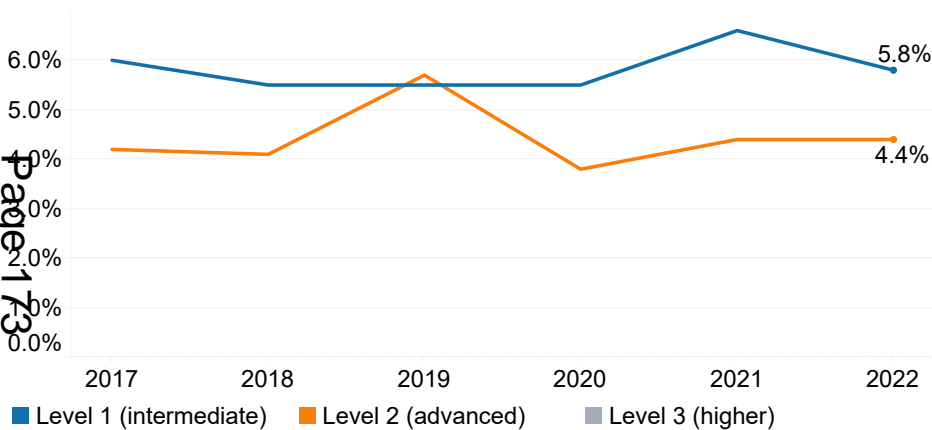

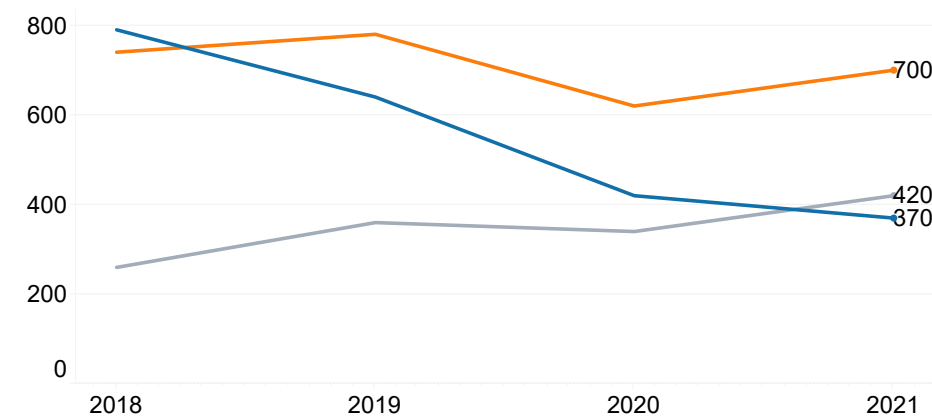

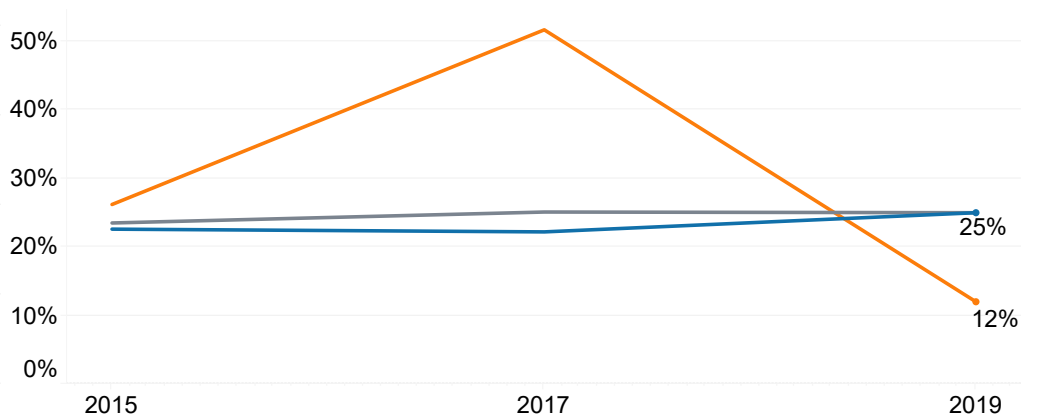
Positive destination, post Key Stage 5 (A level) - proportion in work, education or training

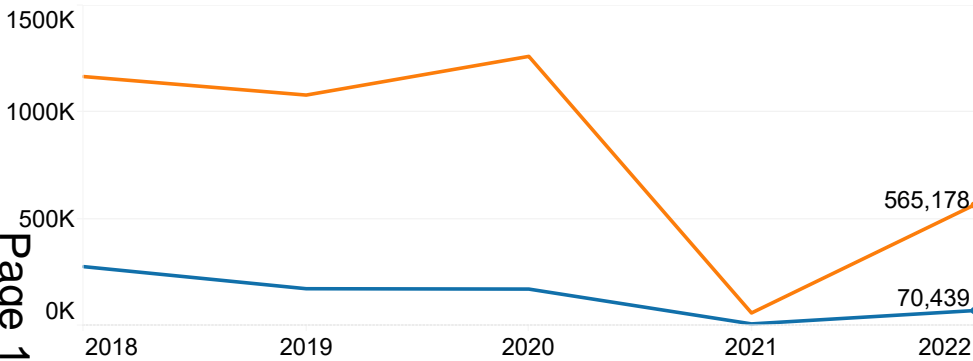

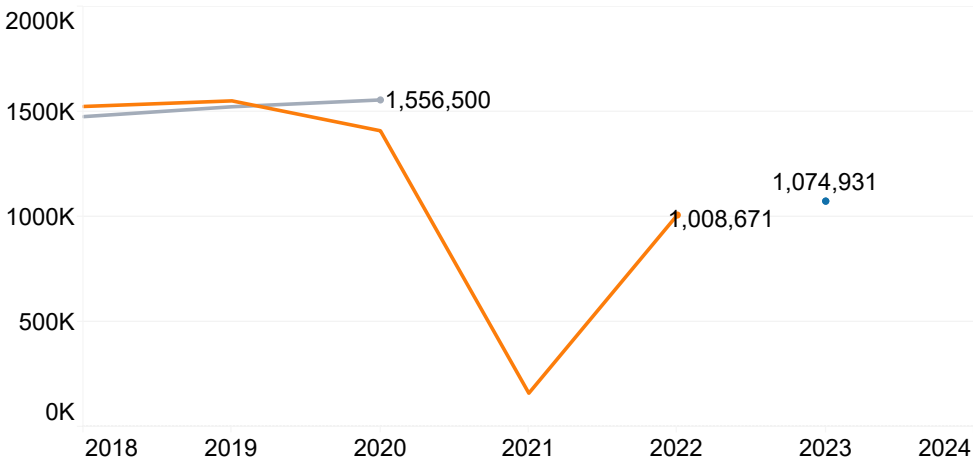

Customer First Centre and branch library visits in North Tyneside

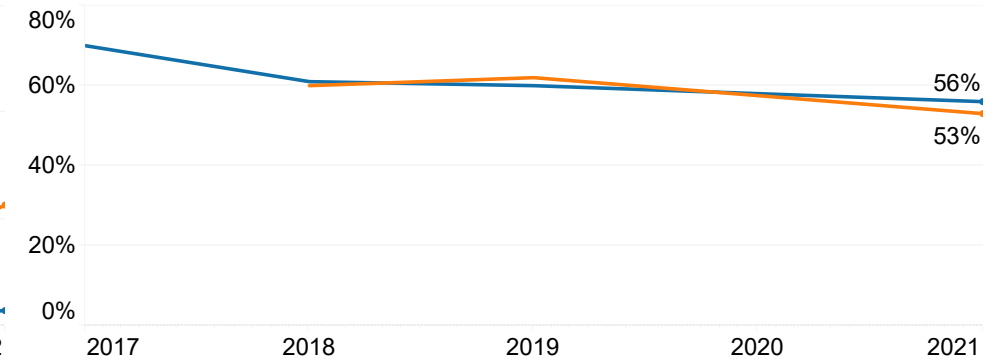

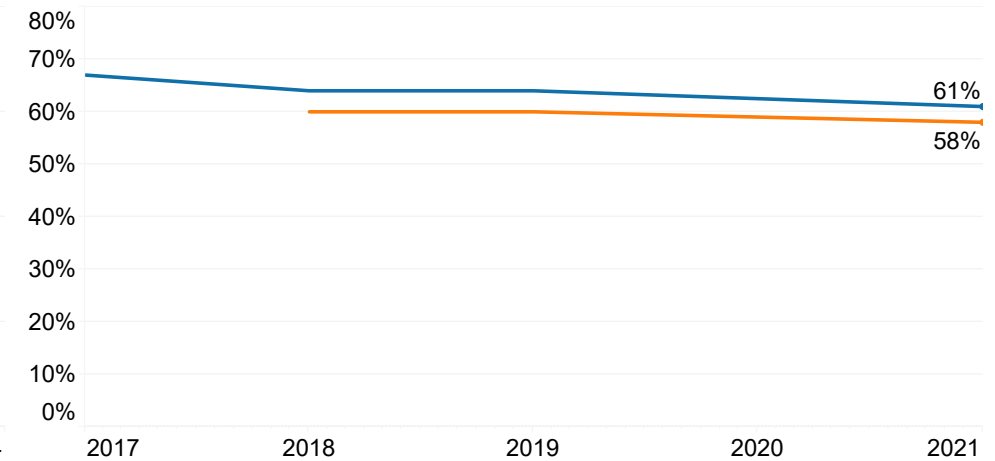


Satisfaction with library facilities

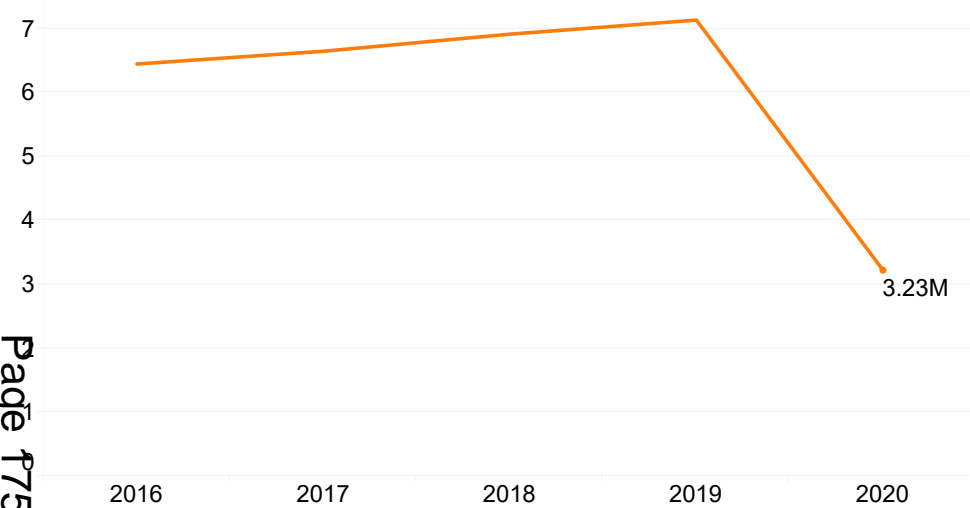

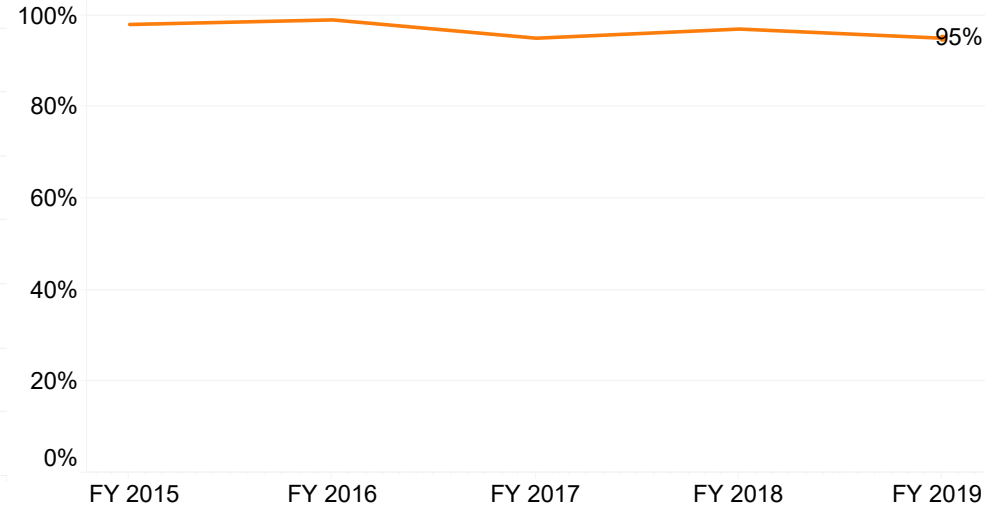

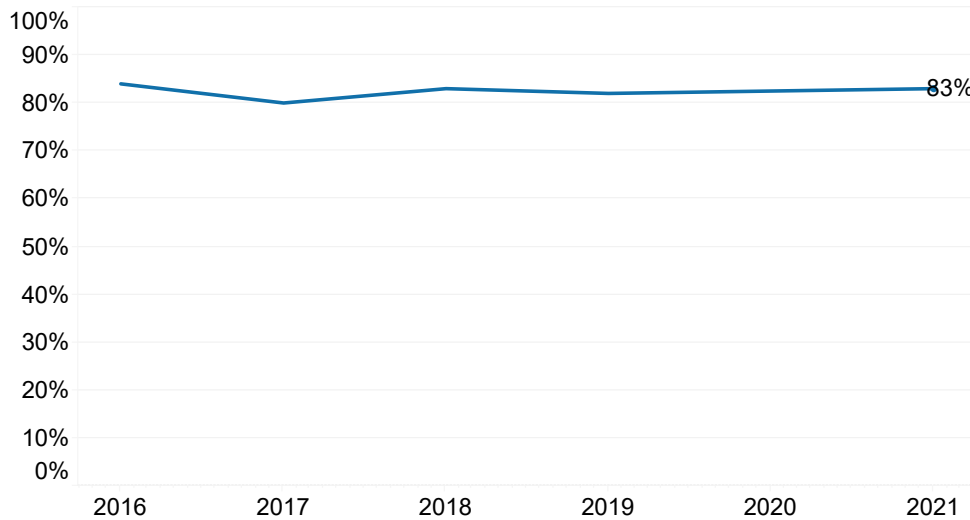
Number of day visits and overnight stays to North Tyneside (millions)



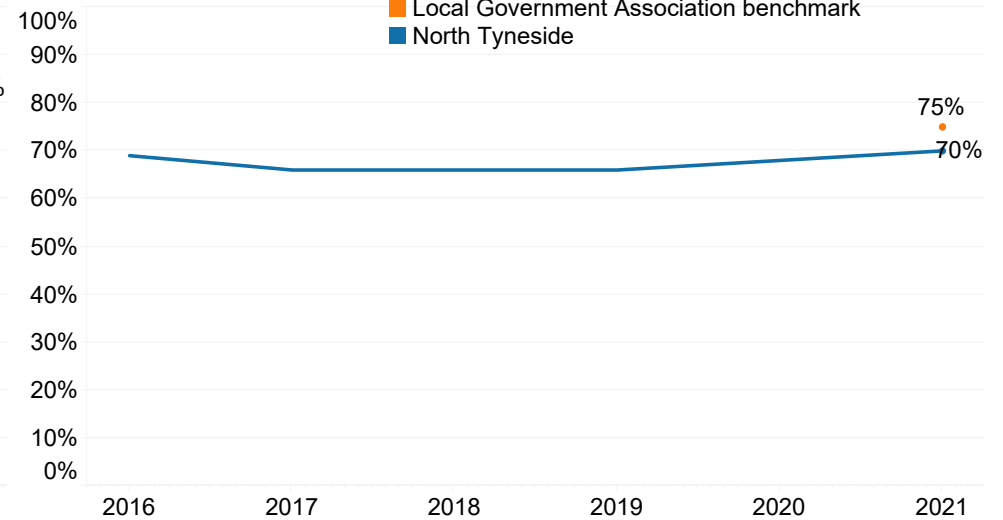
Proportion of visitors to North Tyneside who were satisfied

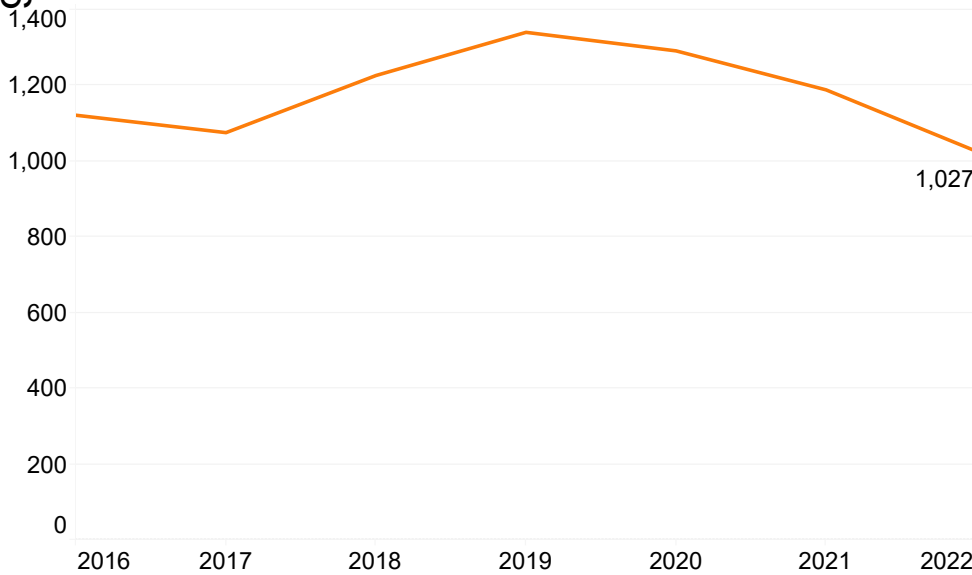

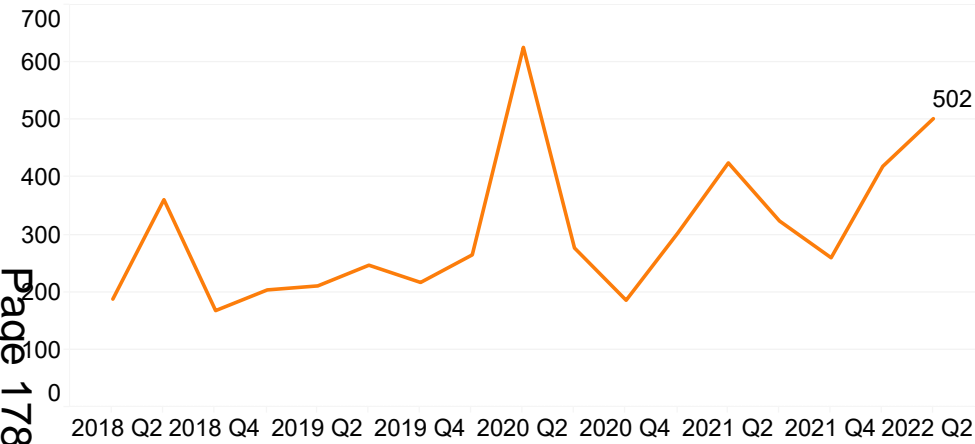

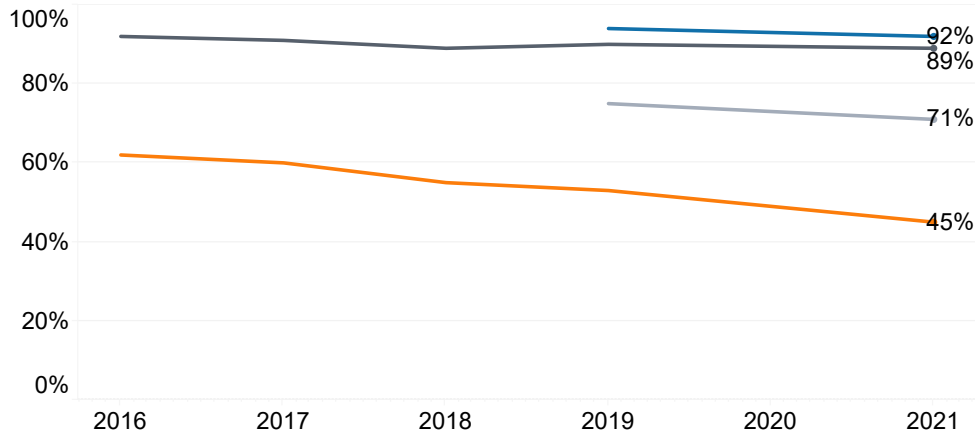


Anti-social behaviour incidents reported to Northumbria Police at a rate of 1,000 population

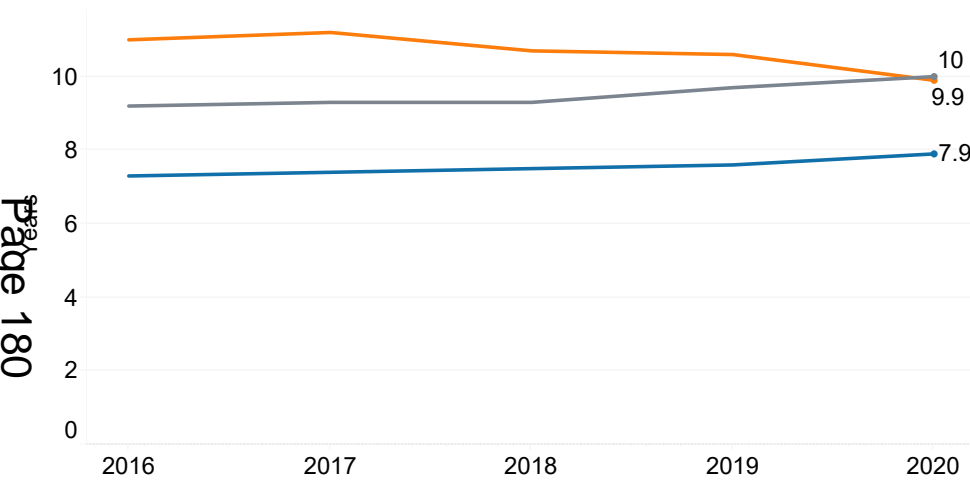

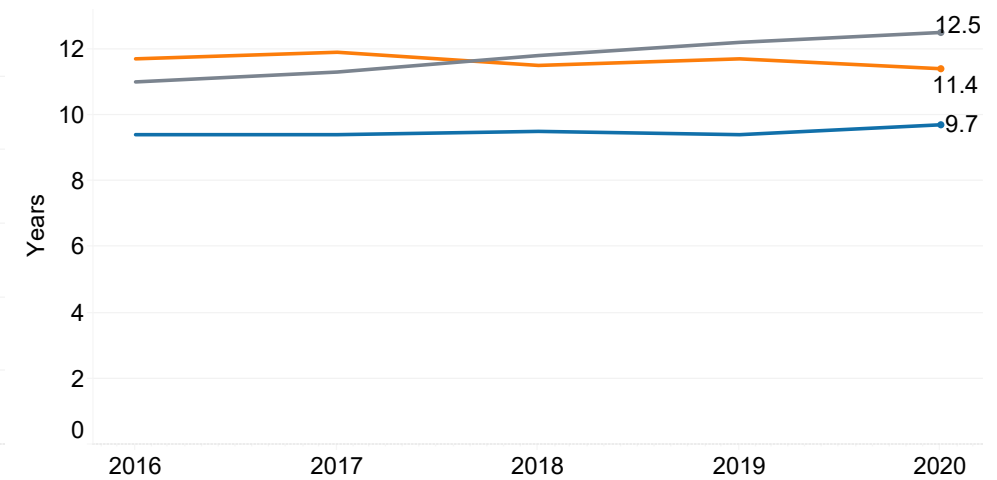

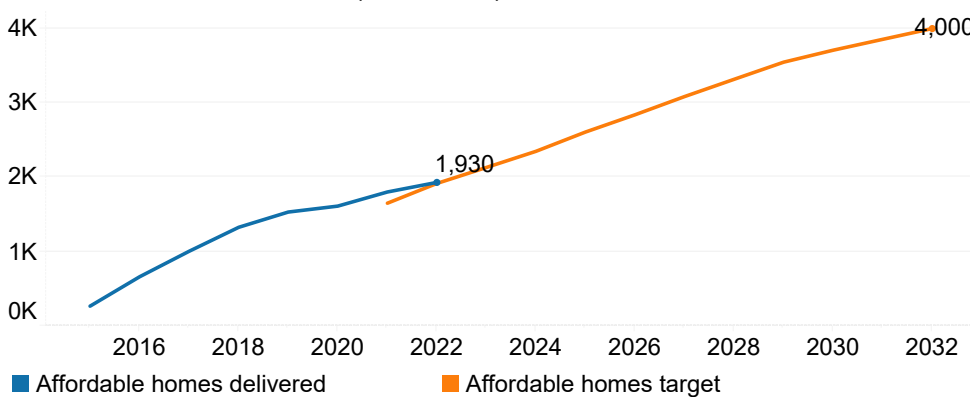
Inequality in life expectancy at birth (female)

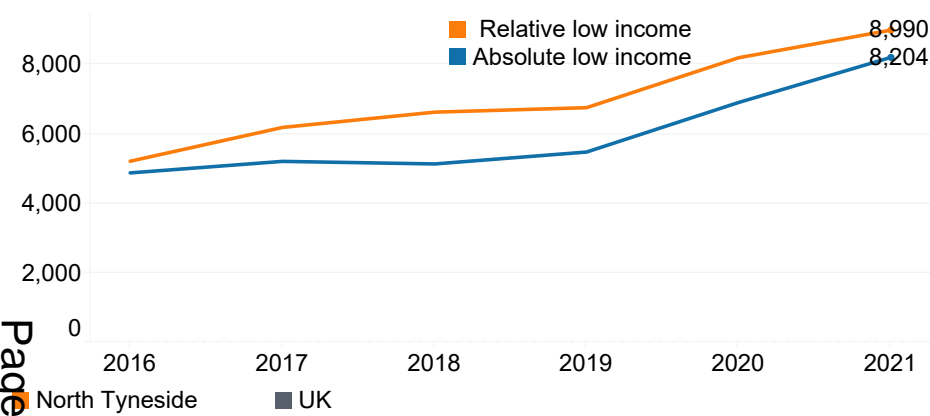

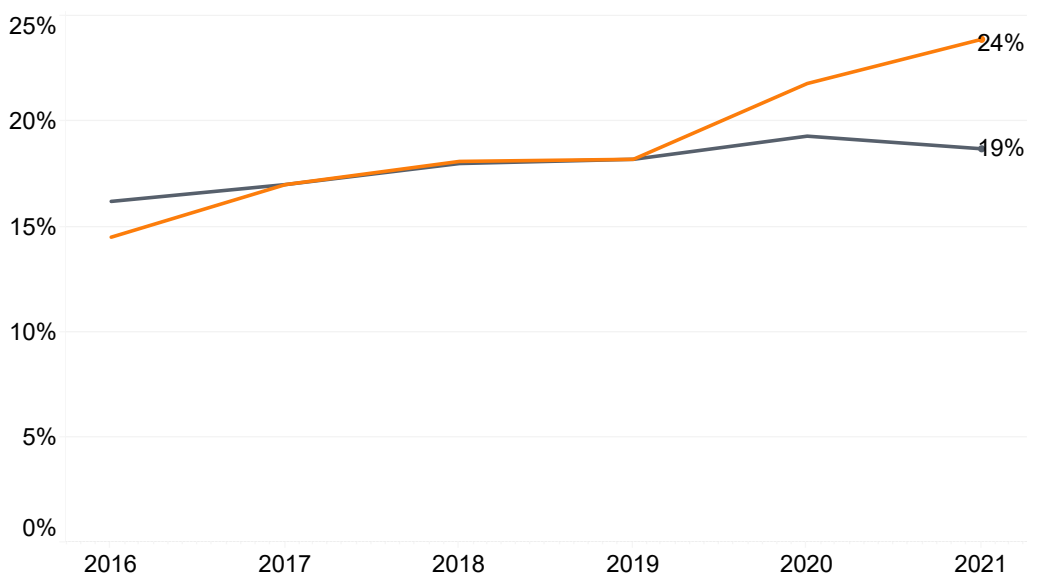

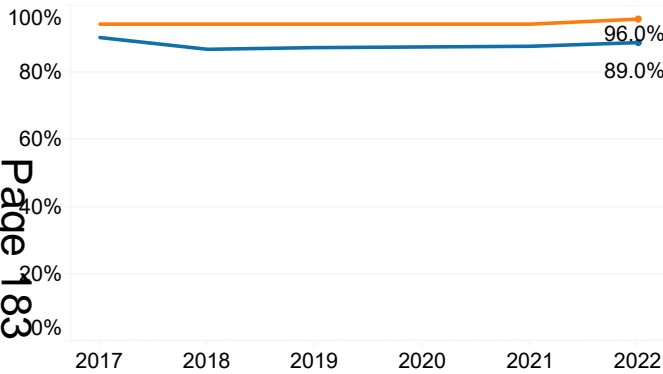

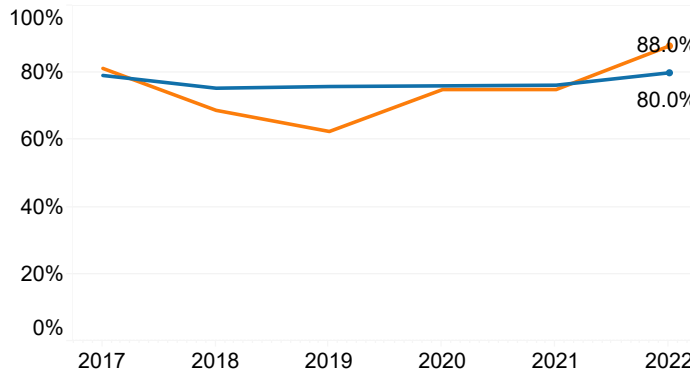

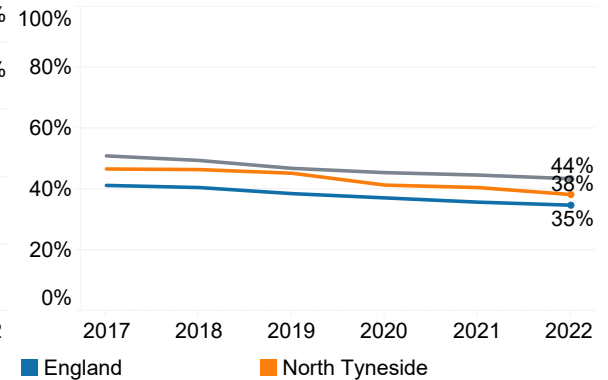
Proportion of Primary Schools rated Good or Outstanding by OFSTED



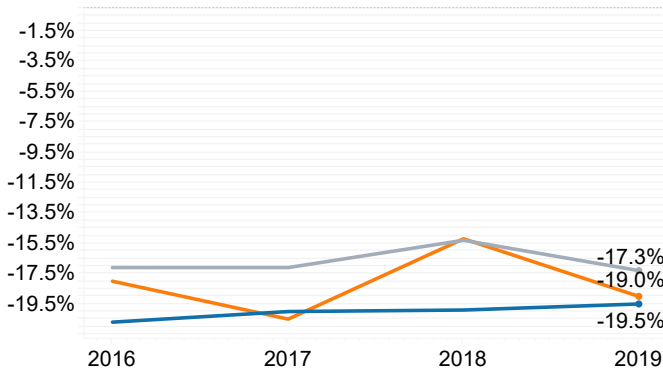

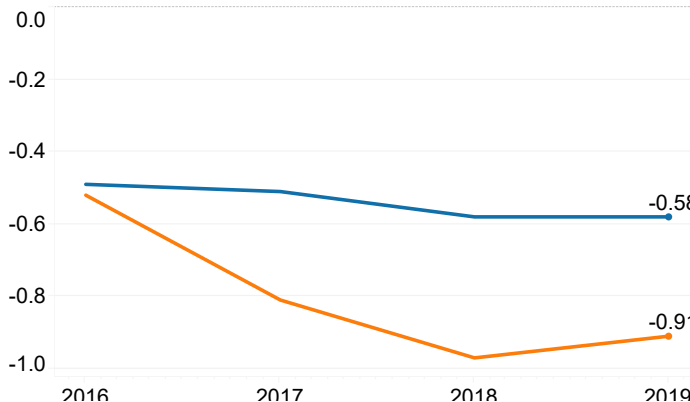
Proportion of pupils with an education, health and care plan (EHCP) educated in Special Schools



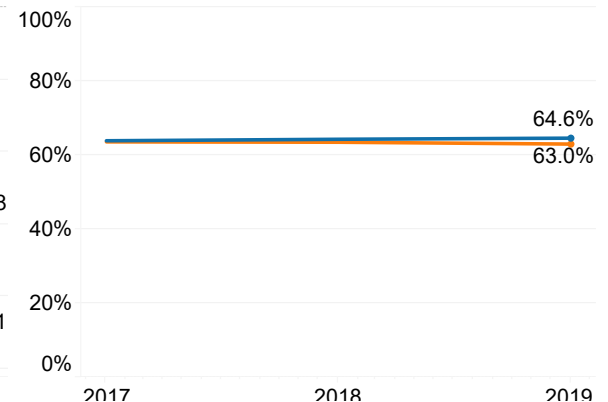
Gap between disadvantaged pupils and non-disadvantaged pupils reaching the Expected Level in Reading, Writing and Maths at Key Stage 2

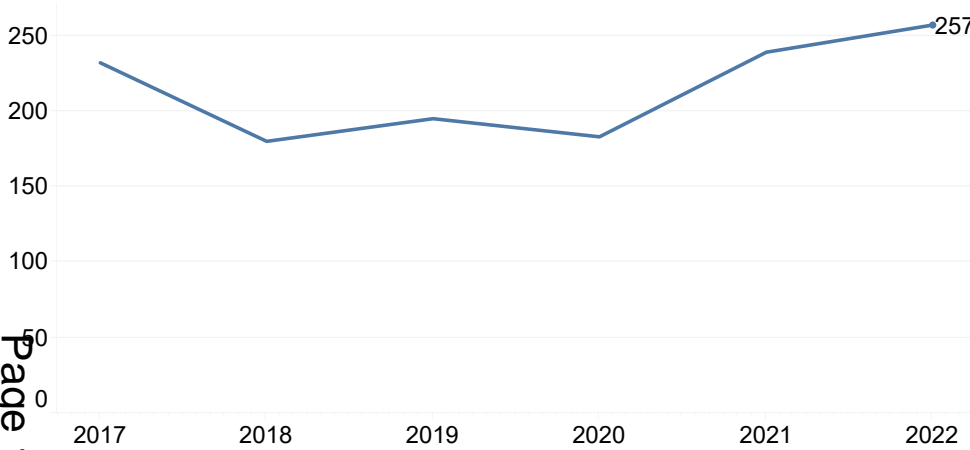

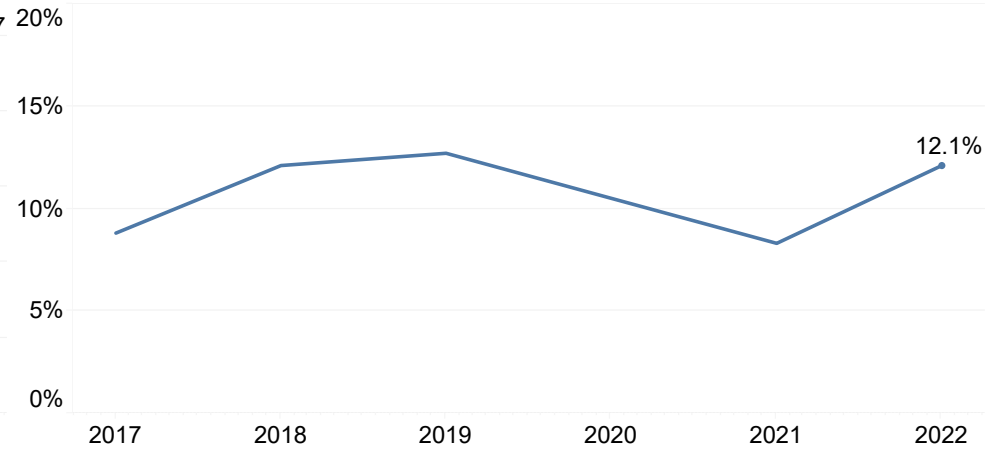

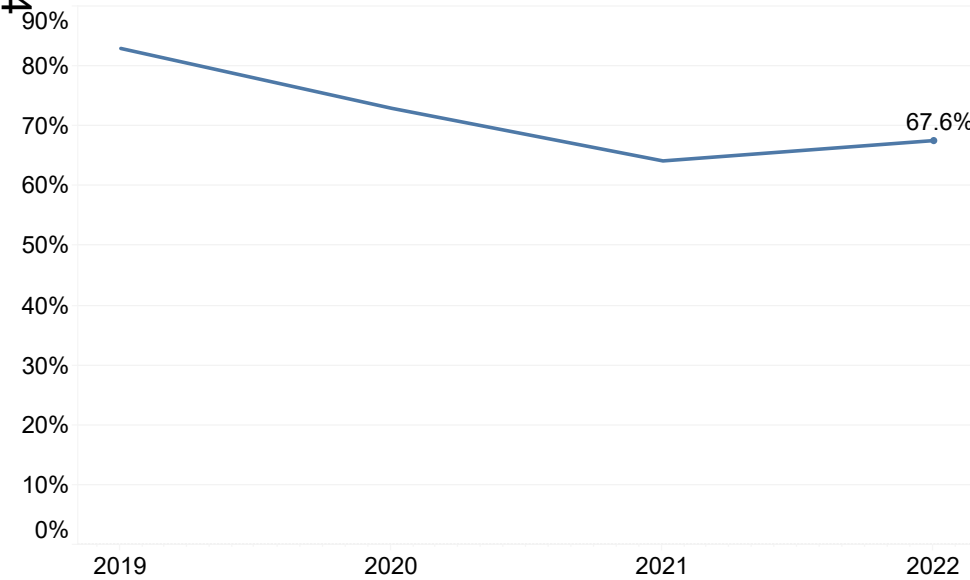

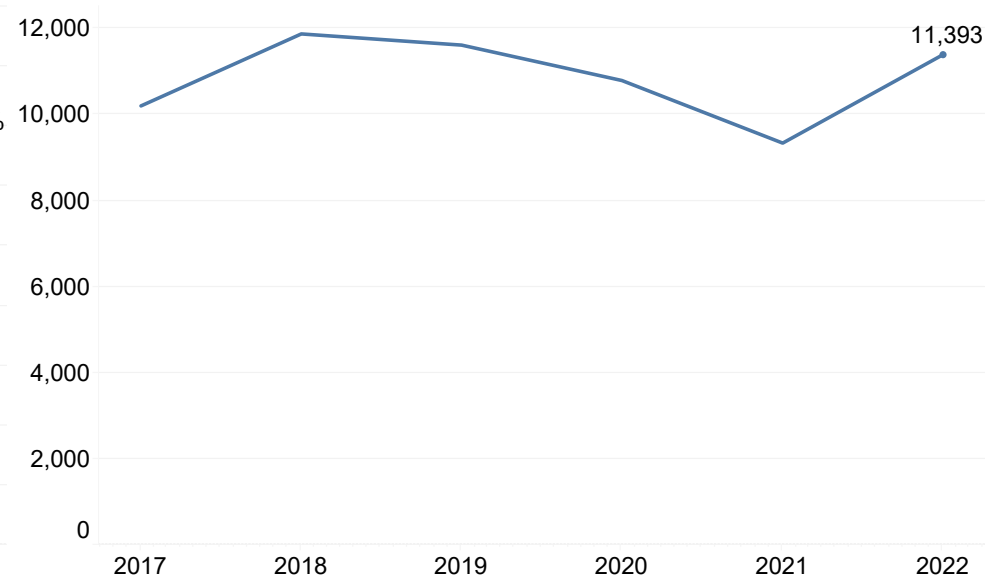
Children in Care Stability - 3 or more Placements %

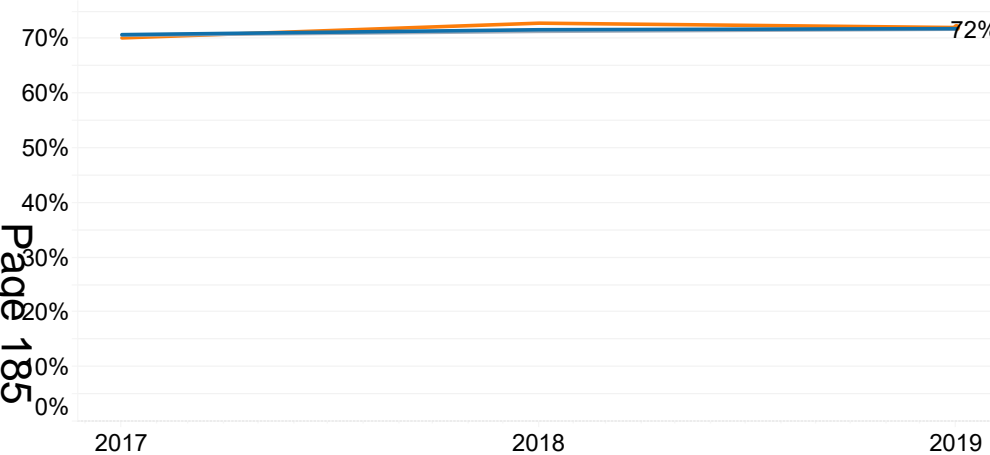

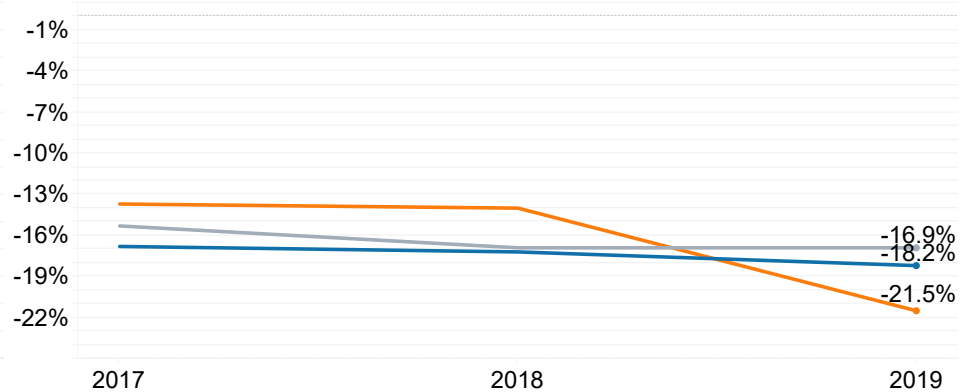

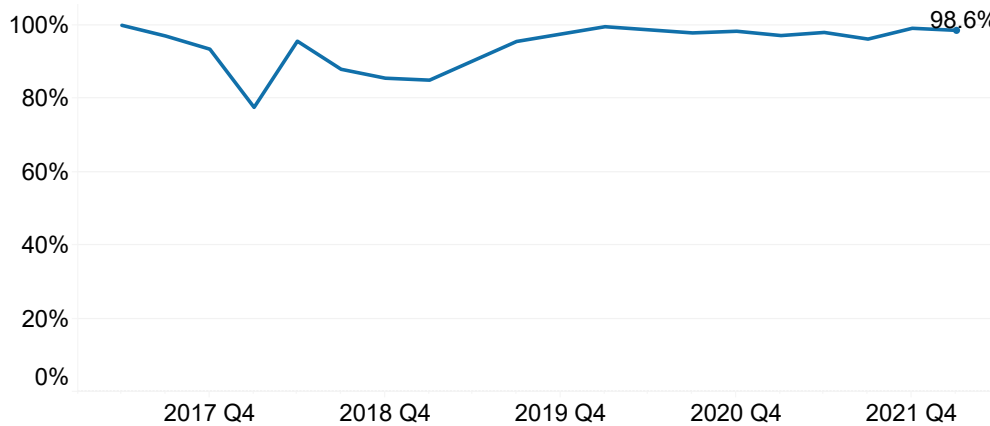
Proportion of pupils reaching a Good Level of Development at Foundation Stage



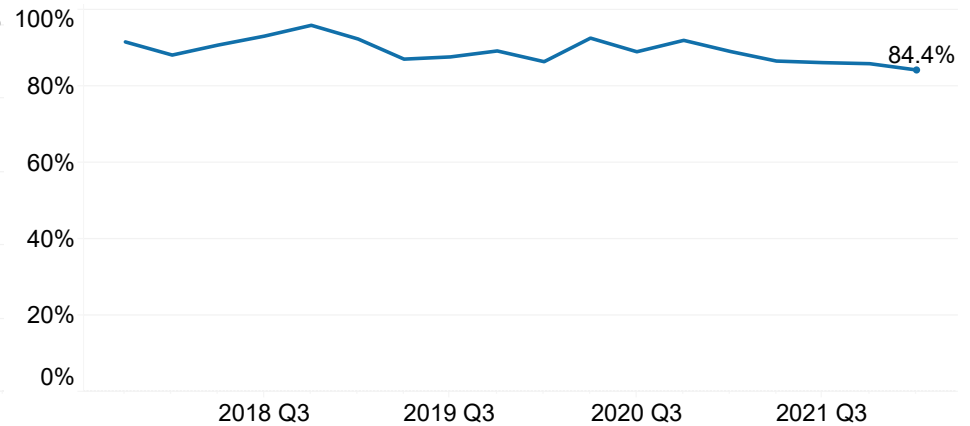
The gap between disadvantaged (free school meals) pupils and their peers reaching the expected level (Good Level of Development at foundation stage)

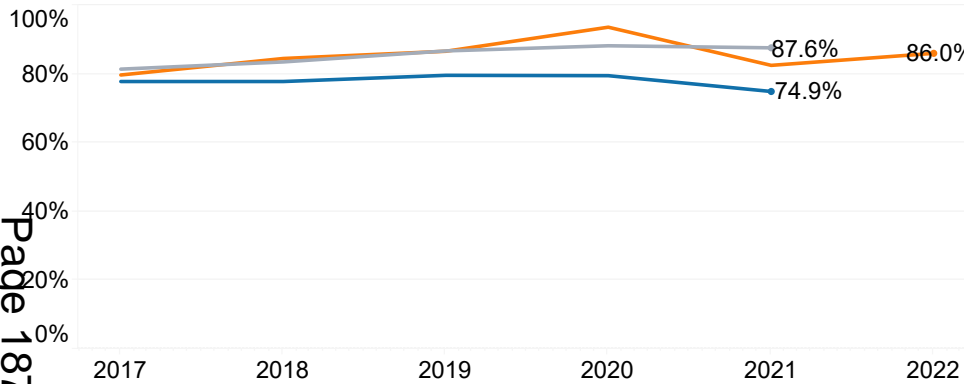

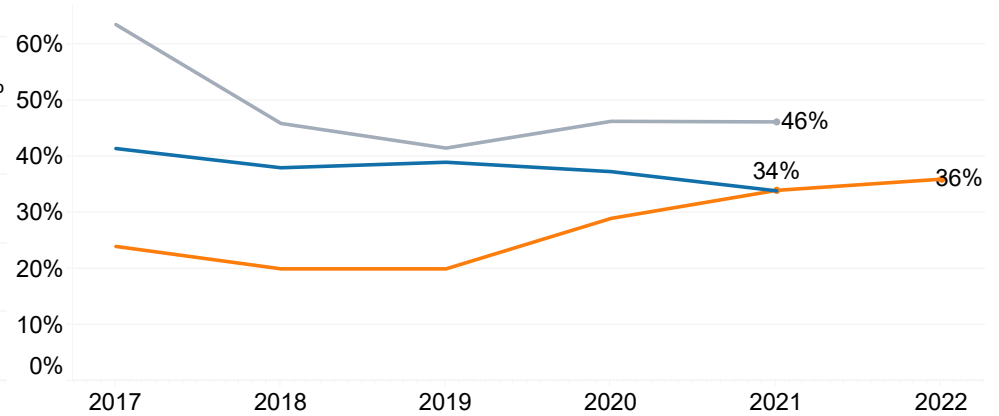

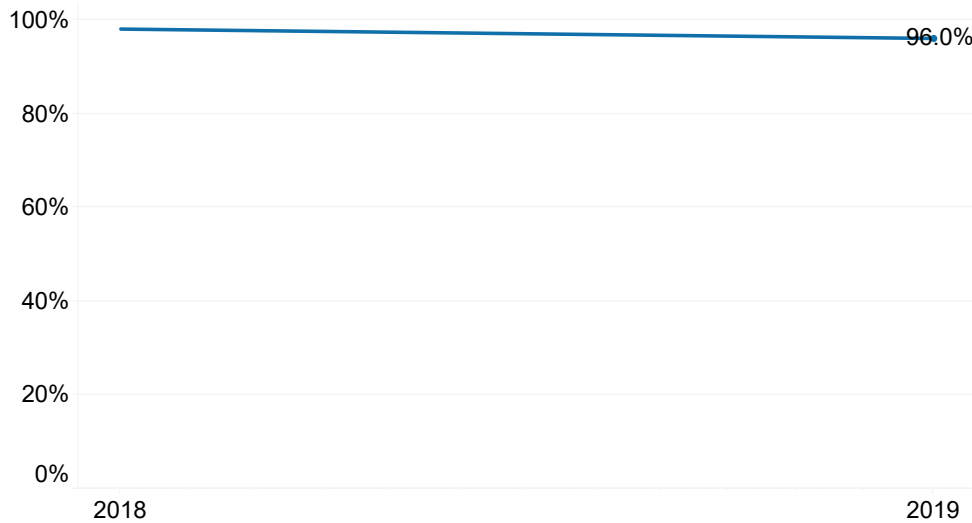
Proportion of people who received a short-term service during the year where the sequel was either no ongoing support or support of a lower level

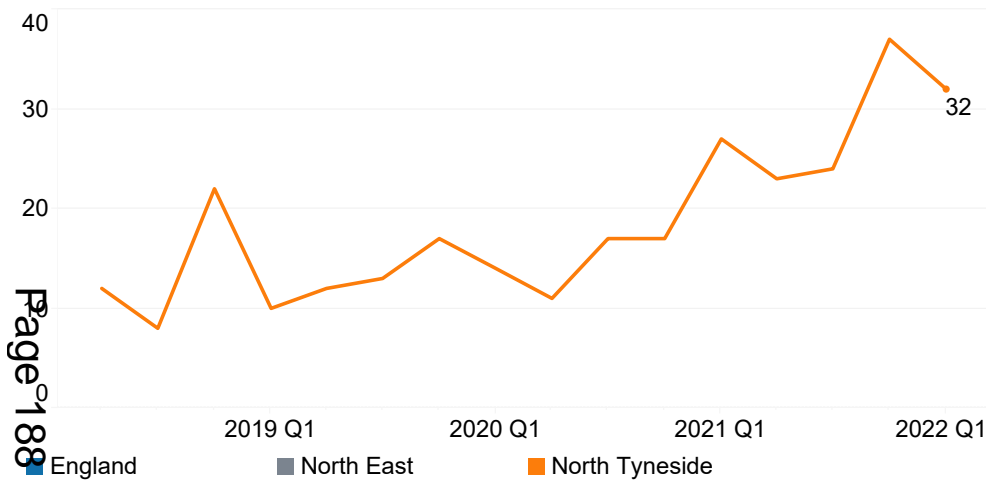

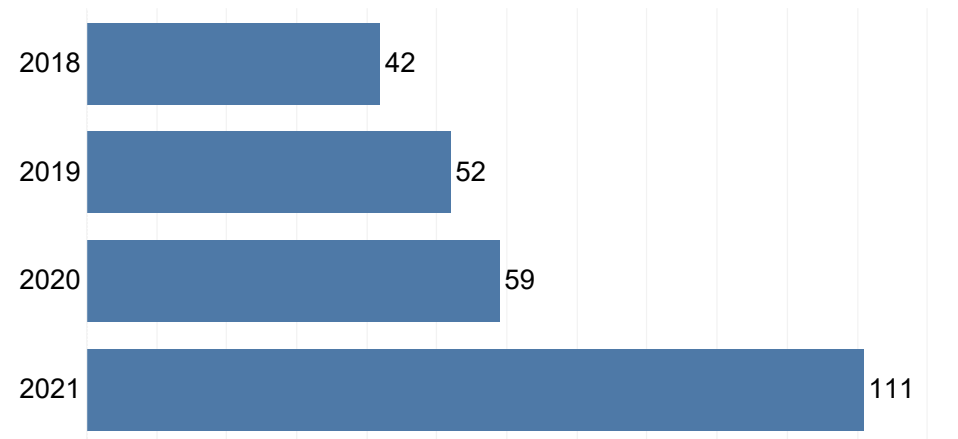

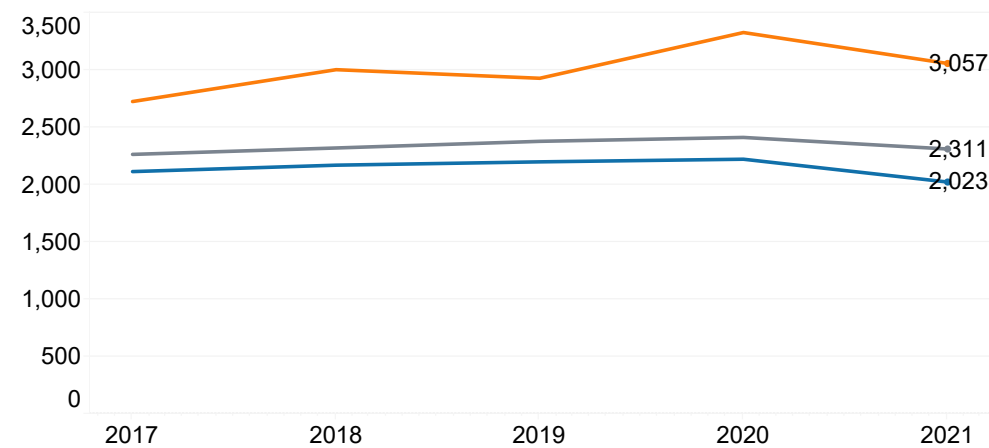
Emergency hospital admissions due to falls in people aged 65+ - rate per 100k

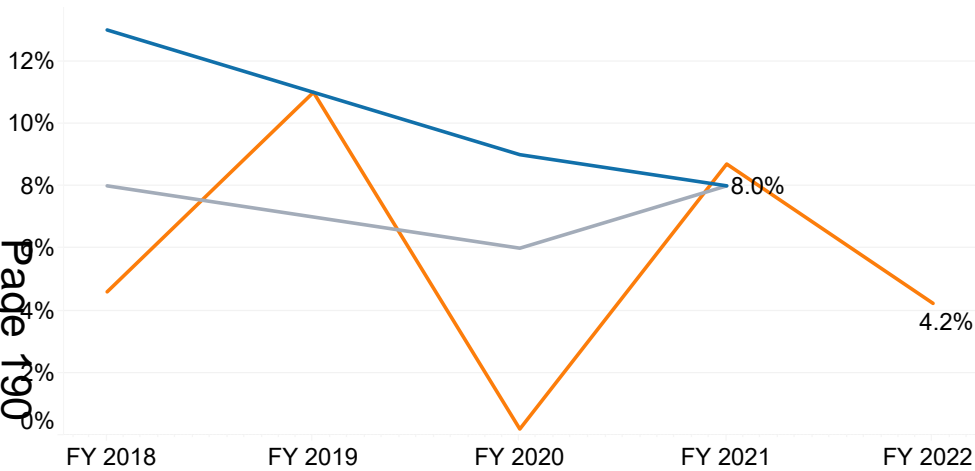

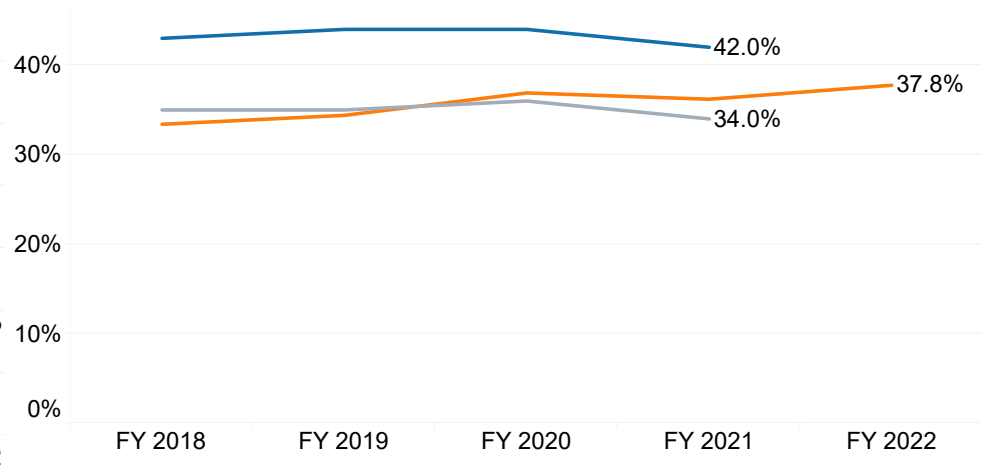

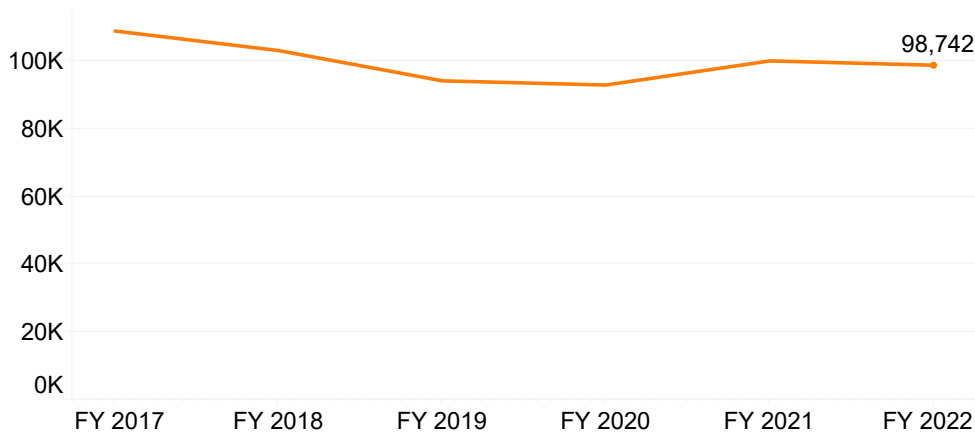
Proportion of municipal waste sent to landfill



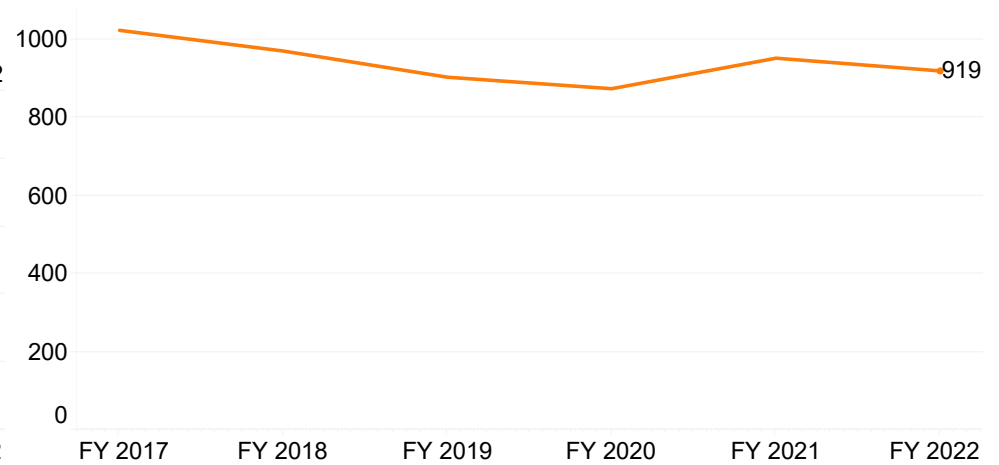
Proportion of household waste sent for reuse, recycling & composting

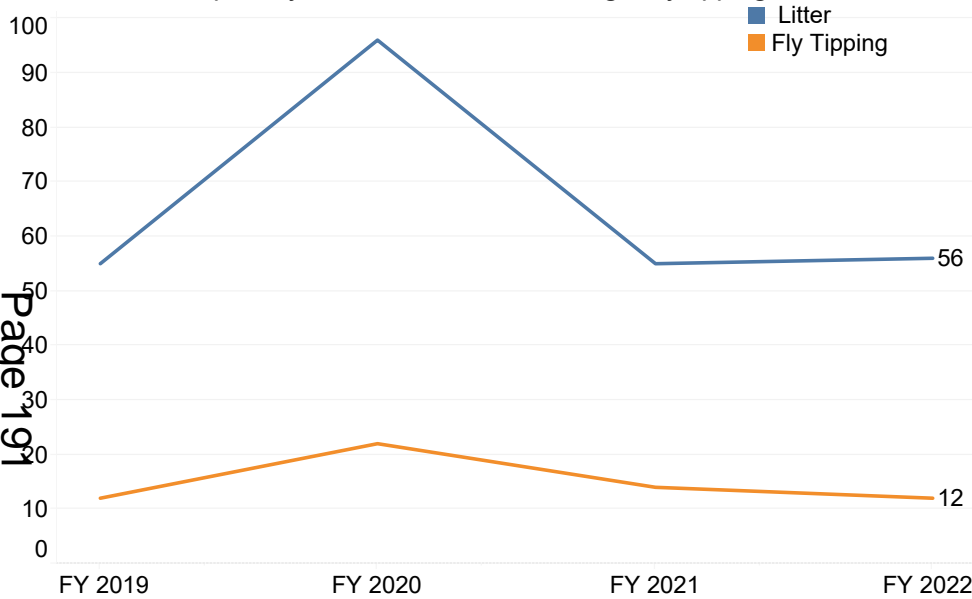

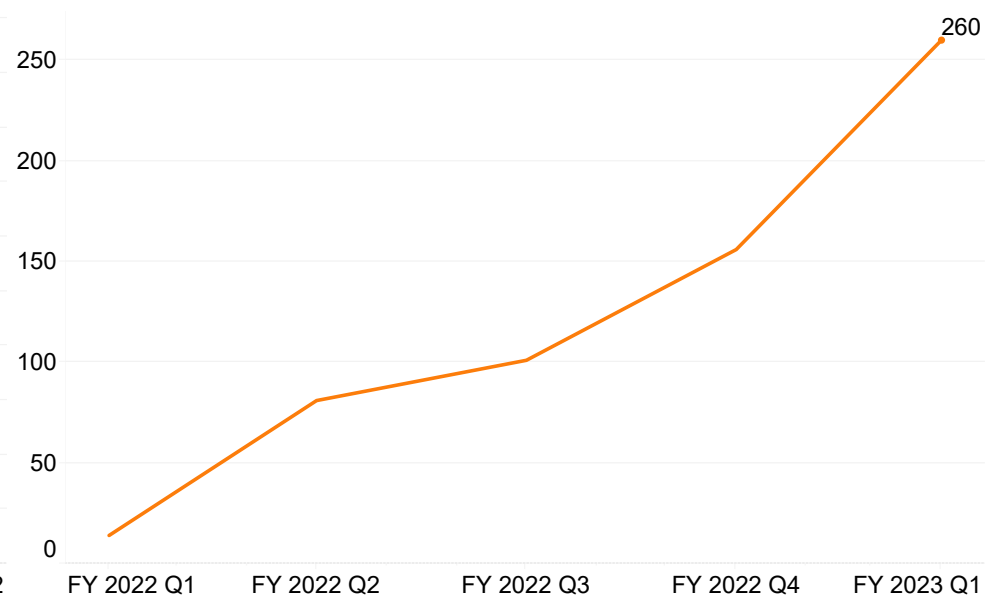

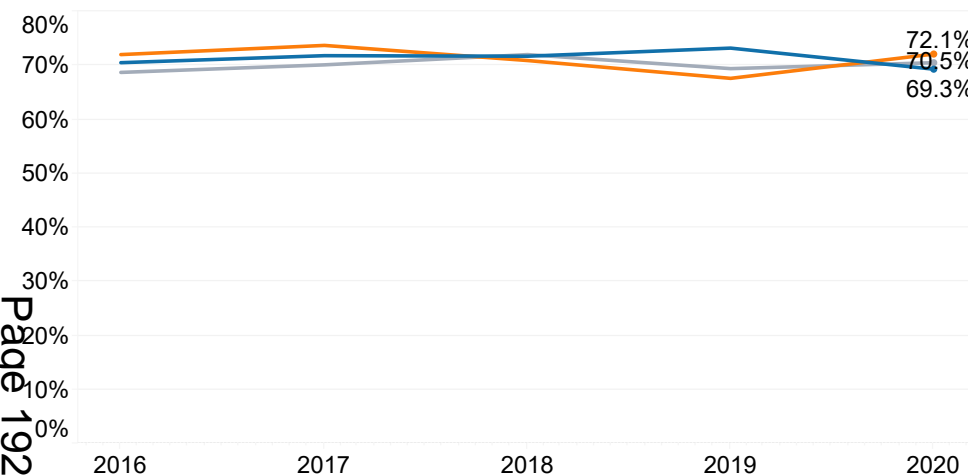

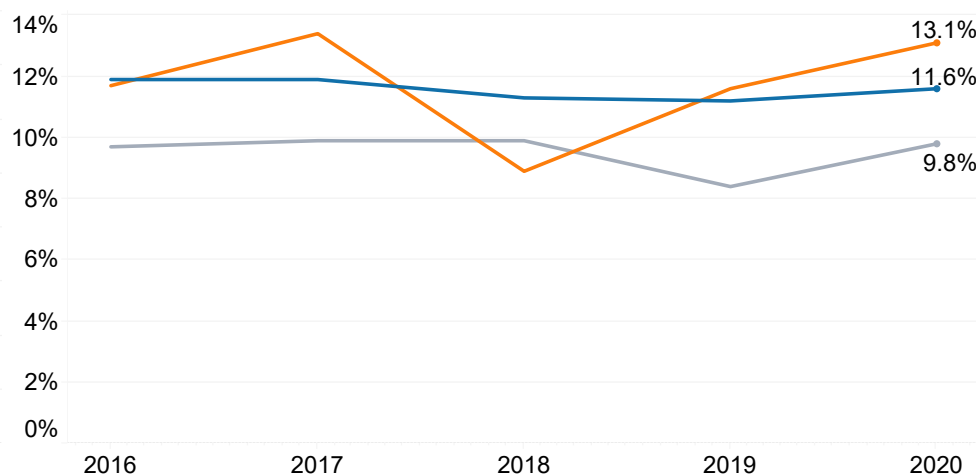

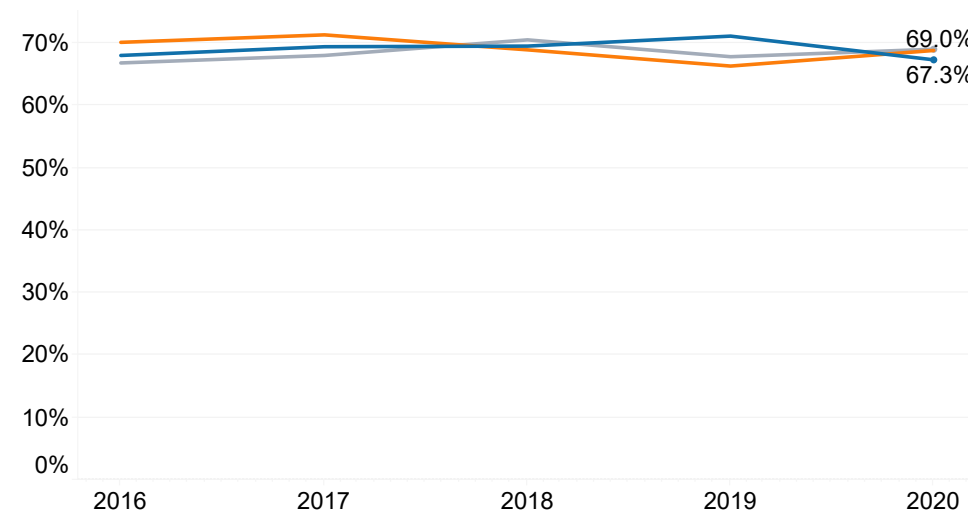
Proportion of adults who do any walking or cycling at least once per week

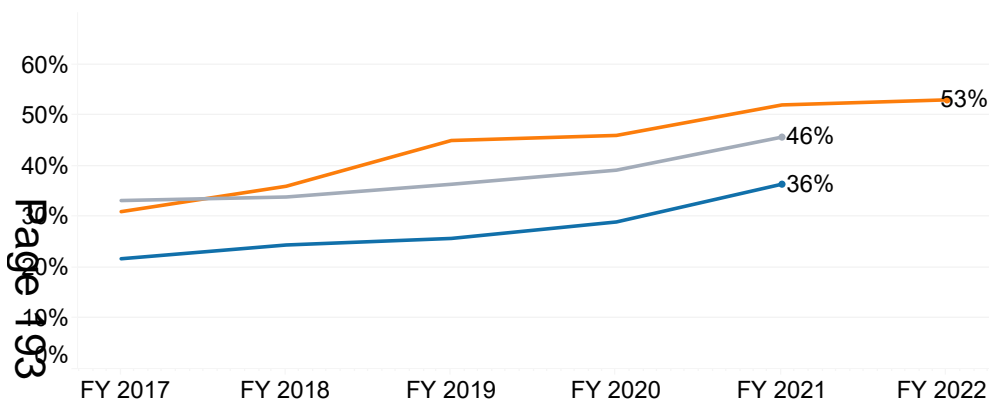
Per capita CO2 emissions (tonnes) 2020

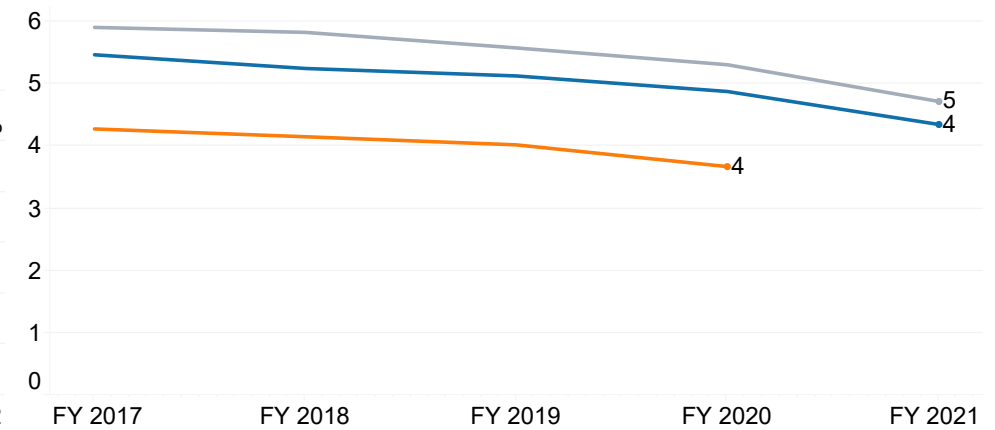
CO2 emissions for North Tyneside (kilotons CO2) 2020
