The park features an extensive nature reserve with ponds, woodlands, grasslands and a working farm. These diverse habitats act as a haven for wildlife. The Countryside Centre has a cosy café, exhibition room and conferencing facilities.














Rising Sun Walking Trails

The starting post is located outside the main gates of the Countryside Centre grounds. Interpretation boards on the park's heritage are situated on footpaths around the park. We also have orienteering packs for sale in Reception for our multi-grade orienteering course set by Newcastle and Tyneside Orienteers.



Green Trail: 20 - 30 minutes (approx 1.2 miles)

Blue Trail: (Continuing from Green Trail) 30 - 40 minutes (approx 1.7 miles)

Red Trail: (Continuing from Blue Trail) 40 - 60 minutes (approx 2 miles) Unsuitable for wheelchairs

Heritage Trail: 11/2 - 2 hours (approx 2.4 miles) Unsuitable for wheelchairs



Park code: Dogs are to be kept on a lead while in the nature reserve, centre grounds and near the farm. Dogs are to be kept under control at all times. Dog bins are sited at all park exits. Please dispose of all dog waste in the bins provided or take home. Take your litter home with you. Cyclists and horse riders are to keep to bridleways and not use the footpaths. There is no access to the edge of the Swallow Pond. Please do not remove plants or animals from the Country Park.
